Little Swift, *Apus affinis*, is a species of swift found in unvegetated or sparsely vegetated land and urban ecosystems. This species occurs over a wide range of habitats and latitudes, though less frequently in truly arid regions, and usually close to human habitation (European Red List 2015).


In the EU27, *Apus affinis* is only found in Spain and has a breeding population size of 1 pairs and a breeding range size of 100 square kilometres in the EU27. The breeding population trend in the EU27 is Increasing in the short term and Increasing in the long term.

The EU population status of *Apus affinis* was assessed as Threatened, as the species meets one or more of the IUCN Red List criteria for threatened at the EU27 scale.





¹ Assessment of status at the European level: The EU assessments of birds population status was made by the European Red List of Birds Consortium (under contract with the European Commission)

The EU27 population trends were assessed using these categories: '+' Increasing, '0' Stable, 'F' Fluctuating, '-' Decreasing, 'xu' Uncertain and 'x' Unknown. The breeding population size is estimated in majority of the cases as 'p' number of pairs. Alternative population units used are: 'males' number of males, 'i' number of individuals, 'cmales' number of calling males and 'bfem' number of breeding females. The winter population size is estimated as number of individuals.

ⁱⁱSpecies trends at the Member State level: The percentage of the EU27 species population occurring in the Member States (% in EU27) is calculated based on the population size reported by the Member States.
