Mr. Jacques Bonnin (DG Environment)

Has joined DG ENV a year ago and he is looking after indicators development. Prior to that he had been working in various departments of the Commission mainly within the fields of innovation and energy. An engineer by training, he started his career in the Shell Group of Companies.

Mr. Jens Günther (Germany)

Has worked at the German Federal Environment Agency since 2009, primarily on development of concepts, strategies and policy measures on resource efficiency and improving sustainable use of natural resources. Jens graduated in Forest Science, and before joining UBA worked for the Forest Stewardship Council Working Group Germany and for ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability (Europe). He is also a key member of the ETC/SCP project team since 2009.

Dr. Frans A. Vollenbroek (the Netherlands)

Studied chemistry in Nijmegen and started his career at Philips Research Laboratories, where he worked on sub-micron lithography. Since 1993 he has worked as a strategist at the Dutch Ministry of Environment and contributed to the National Environmental Policy Plans. He was seconded to the European Commission between 2001-2005 where he drafted the two Communications on the Thematic Strategy on the Sustainable Use of Natural Resources. Currently he is policy advisor for natural resources in the Ministry of Infrastructure and the Environment.


Ms. Merja Saarnilehto (Finland)

Merja graduated in Environmental Economics, and before the ministry she worked over ten years for Statistics Finland developing the environmental economic accounting systems.
