



Forests dominated by Scots pine (*Pinus sylvestris*) in the Scottish Highlands are similar to the Western Taiga (habitat type 9010) found in the Boreal region. The field layer is usually dominated by ericaceous species and bryophytes are abundant. Assessed as 'unfavourable-bad' due to 'structure and function' although as a result of conservation efforts over many years the conservation status is improving.
