



Yew (*Taxus baccata*) woods of dry valleys and scarp slopes on the chalk and limestone hills of England and Ireland. The majority of the habitat area (more than 90%) is in England.

The conservation status in both countries is 'unfavourable-bad'. Due to lack of natural regeneration the age structure of the canopy trees forming this habitat is poor. Atmospheric pollution can be responsible for soil eutrophication leading to the spreading of nitrophilous species not typical of this habitat. Both factors negatively influence the structures and functions of the habitat.
