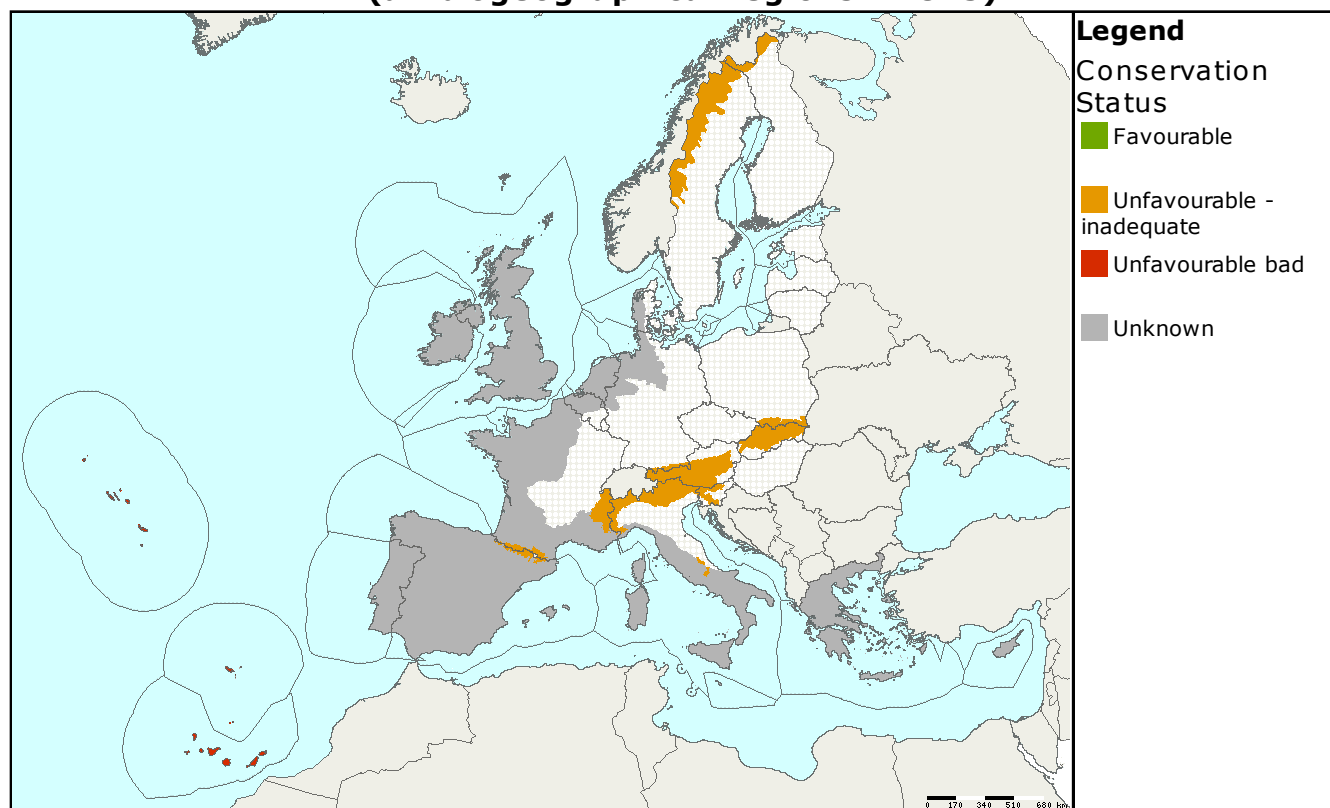

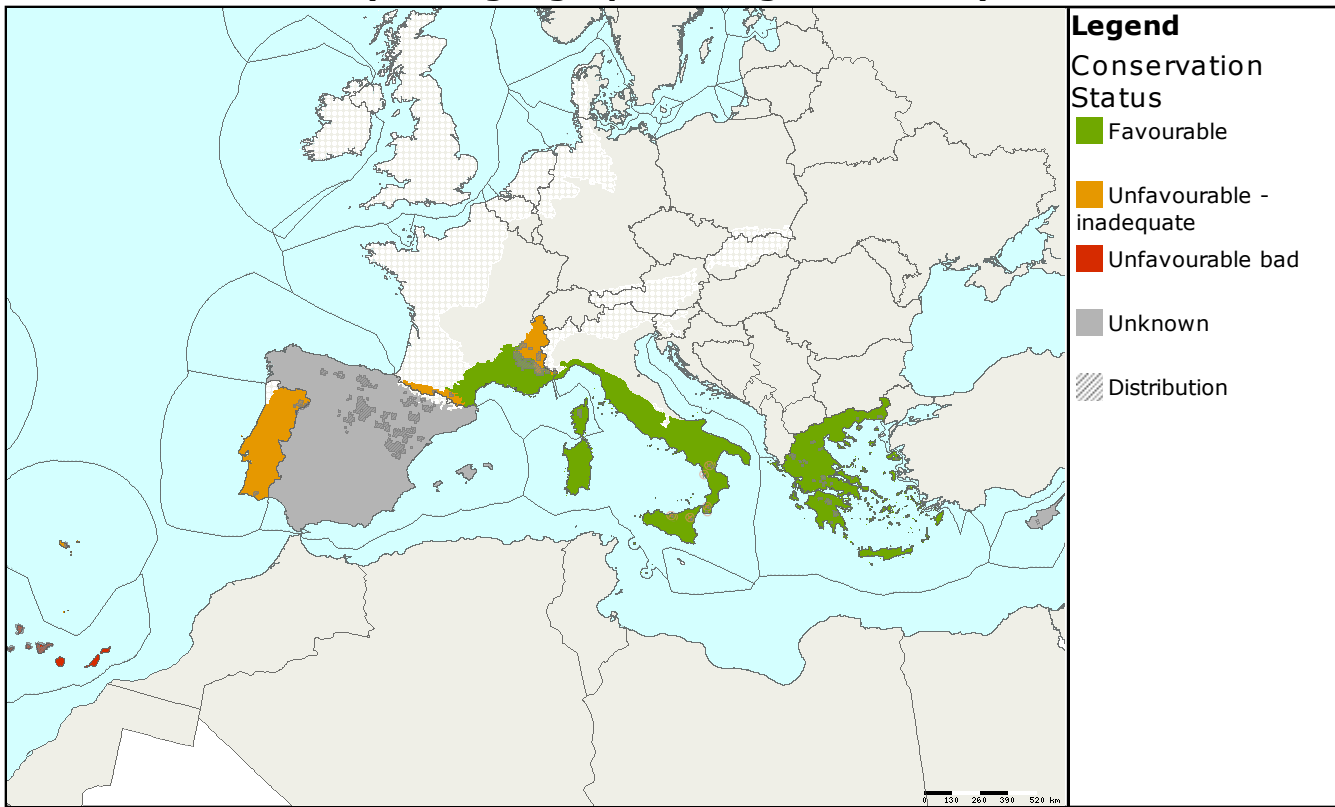

Forests at middle altitudes dominated by various species of juniper - Spanish juniper (*Juniperus thuriferae*) in Spain and southern France (including Corsica); Greek juniper (*J. excelsa*) in the mountains of northern Greece; stinking juniper (*J. foetidissima*) in Greek mountains; Syrian juniper (*J. drupacea*) on the northern slopes of Mount Parnon, Greece; Canary Islands juniper (*J. cedrus*), Phoenician juniper (*J. phoenicea*) and Azores juniper (*J. brevifolia*) in the mountains of Macaronesia.

The conservation status in the Atlantic and in the Mediterranean regions is 'unknown'. However, in the Mediterranean region at the national level 'favourable' assessment prevails except Portugal, where it is 'unfavourable inadequate'. In the Alpine region, where the habitat occurs only in France the status is 'unfavourable inadequate'. In the Macaronesian region it is 'unfavourable bad'. The habitat range and area are decreasing mainly as a result of direct human induced destruction of habitat.
