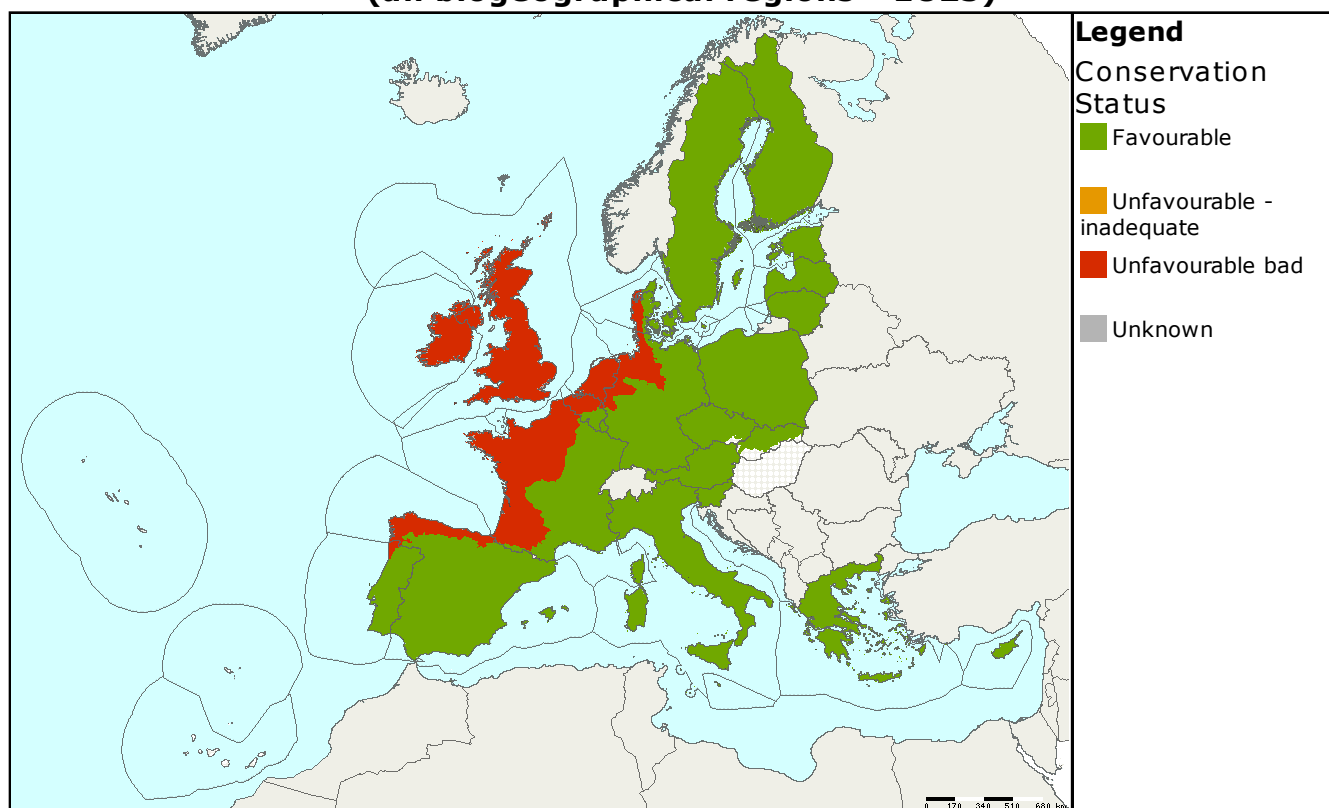

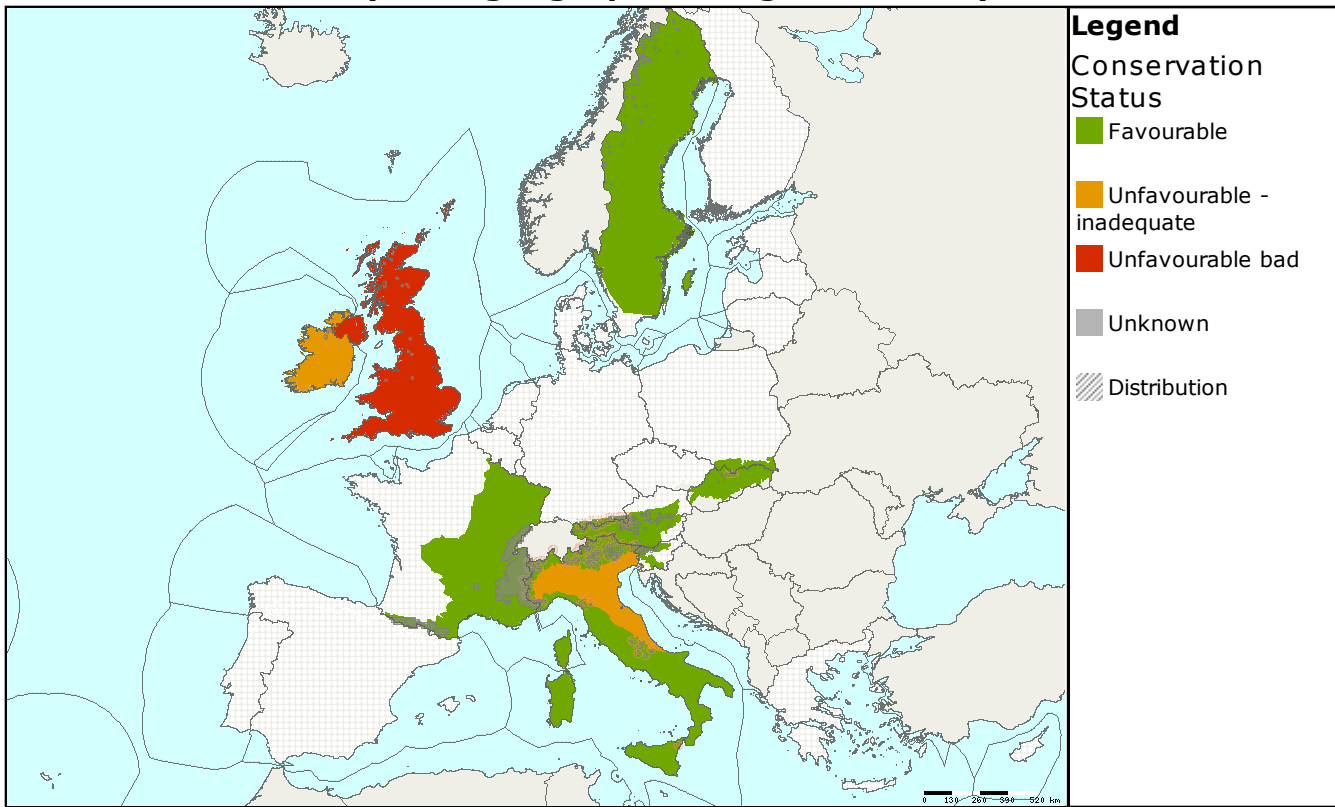

Screes formed from calcareous rocks typical of the mountains of northern and central Europe although also found in the Pyrenees and locally in central Italy. This habitat has been assessed as 'favourable' for the Alpine, Boreal, Continental and Mediterranean regions. Within these regions only Italy (Continental) has reported this habitat as unfavourable.

In the Atlantic region this habitat has been assessed as 'unfavourable-inadequate' due to bad (but improving) 'structure and functions' in the United Kingdom with Ireland reporting all parameters except 'range' as 'unfavourable-inadequate'.

Both Ireland and the United Kingdom report grazing, as a threat and pressure.
