

Low scrub formed by curry plant (*Helichrysum italicum*) with spurges (*Euphorbia* spp) and other species of scrub occurring just inland of cliff tops and subject to the sea's influence. The habitat is relatively rare along the coast of the central Mediterranean from the Balearic Islands (Spain) to southern Italy, it also occurs locally on the west coast of Portugal.

Assessed as 'unfavourable-inadequate' by all member states except Italy where it is 'favourable' although 'structure and functions' are reported as 'unknown'. Threats and pressures are mostly related to inappropriate land management.
