



The Iberian midwife toad is species restricted to southern and eastern Portugal and western and central Spain. It is closely associated with meadows and open oak (Quercus) forests, most often in sandy areas. The greatest occurrence of species is recorded from Portugal with good future prospects. Overall assessment is 'unknown but not favourable'. Species is assessed as 'nearly threatened' in the IUCN Red List due to a significant decline.
