



The horseshoe whip snake occurs in the south-western Europe and in the north-western Africa. It is relatively common in the southern part of the Iberian Peninsula, further towards the north it becomes rare. In Italy it occurs only in Sardinia. It inhabits wide spectrum of natural, semi-natural and even artificial habitats excluding wet and humid stands.

The conservations status in the Atlantic biogeographical region, where the species occurs only in Portugal is 'favourable'. In the Mediterranean biogeographical region the status is 'unknown', the reports provided for the species in this biogeographical regions are incomplete. Better information is required to make a comprehensive assessment.
