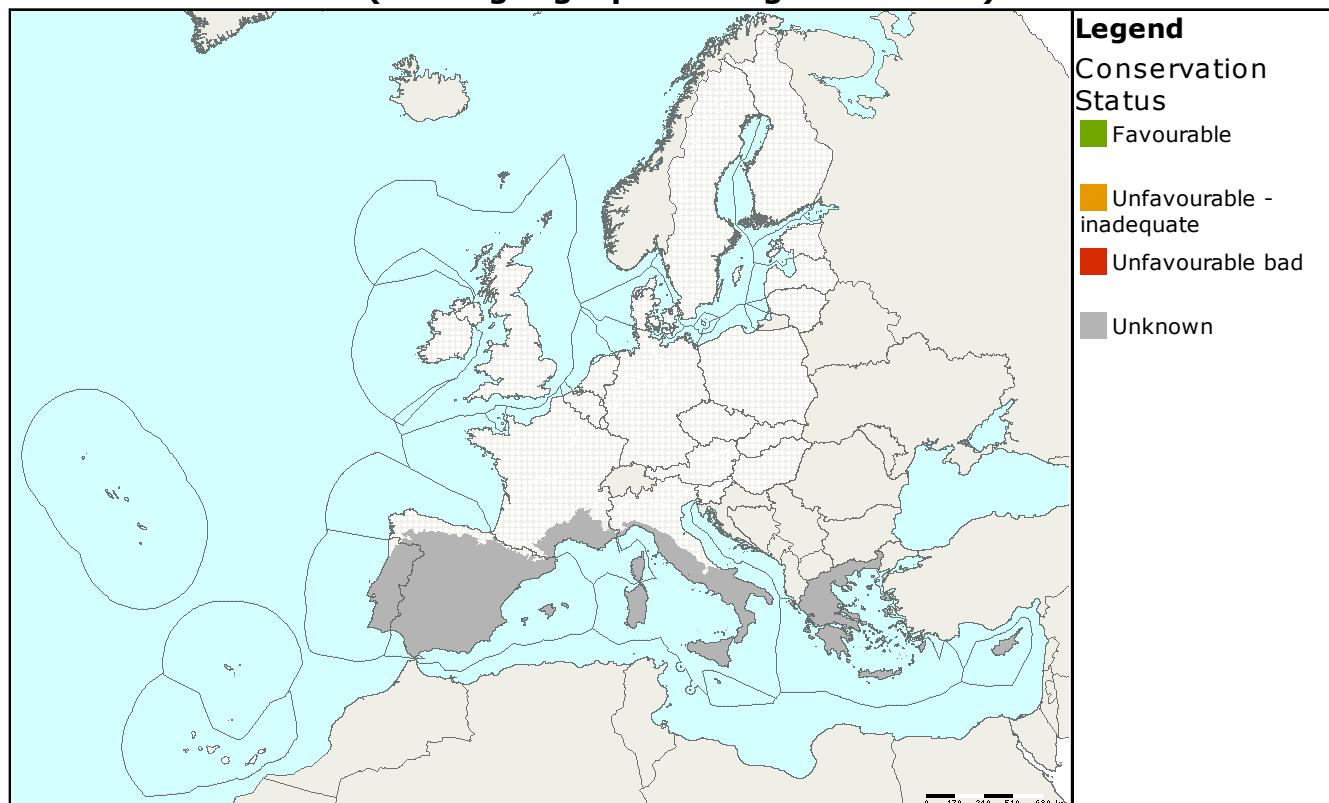

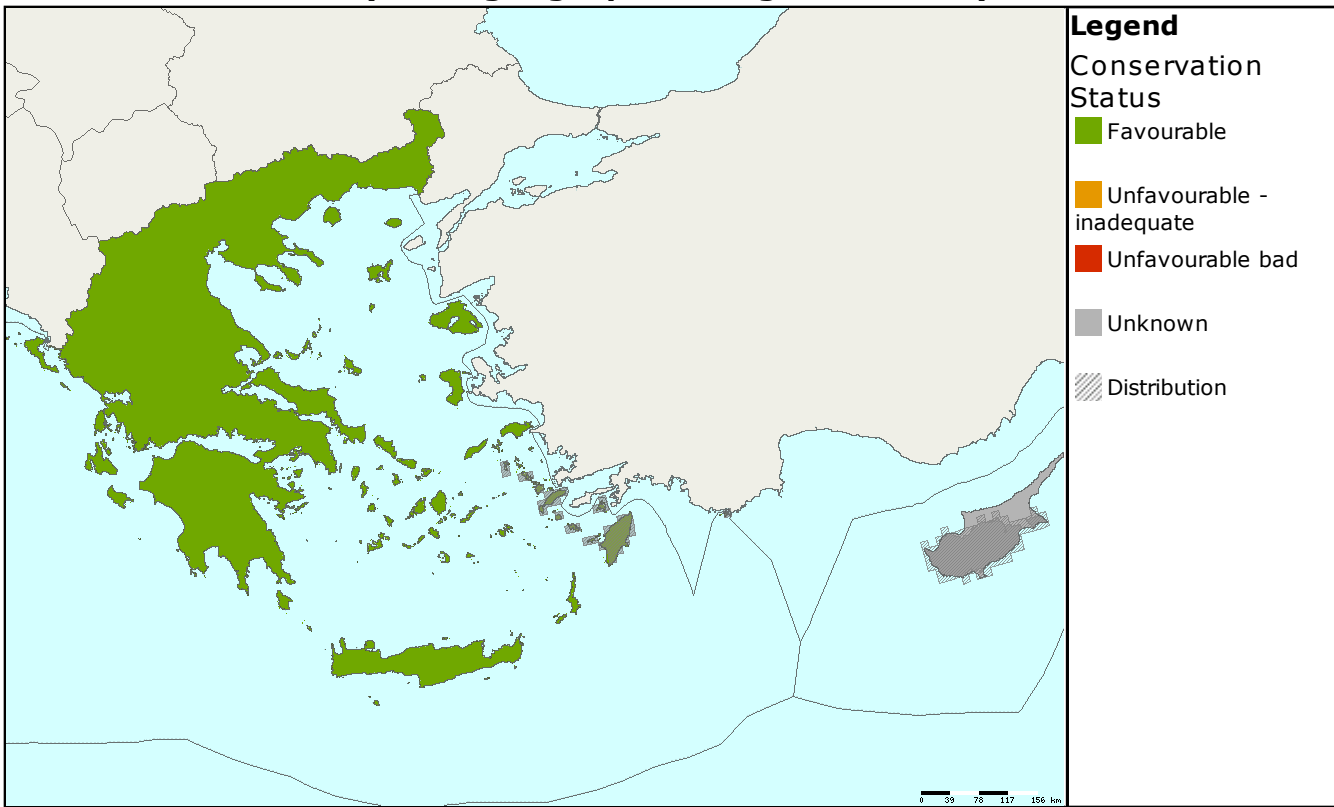

Coluber jugularis is a snake found in Greece, Turkey, Cyprus, Northern Iraq and Syria. It normally occurs in lowlands. Due to its common distribution, this species has never been inventoried or monitored. Poor knowledge and missing information in both Greek and Cyprian reports. Overall assessment is 'unknown'. Future prospects were evaluated as 'favourable' in Cyprus. However in the opinion of the local NGO FFE0 the habitat of the species is being continuously deteriorated and so future prospects should be evaluated as 'unfavourable inadequate'. This would result in the 'inadequate' overall assessment at the national and as well at the biogeographical level.
