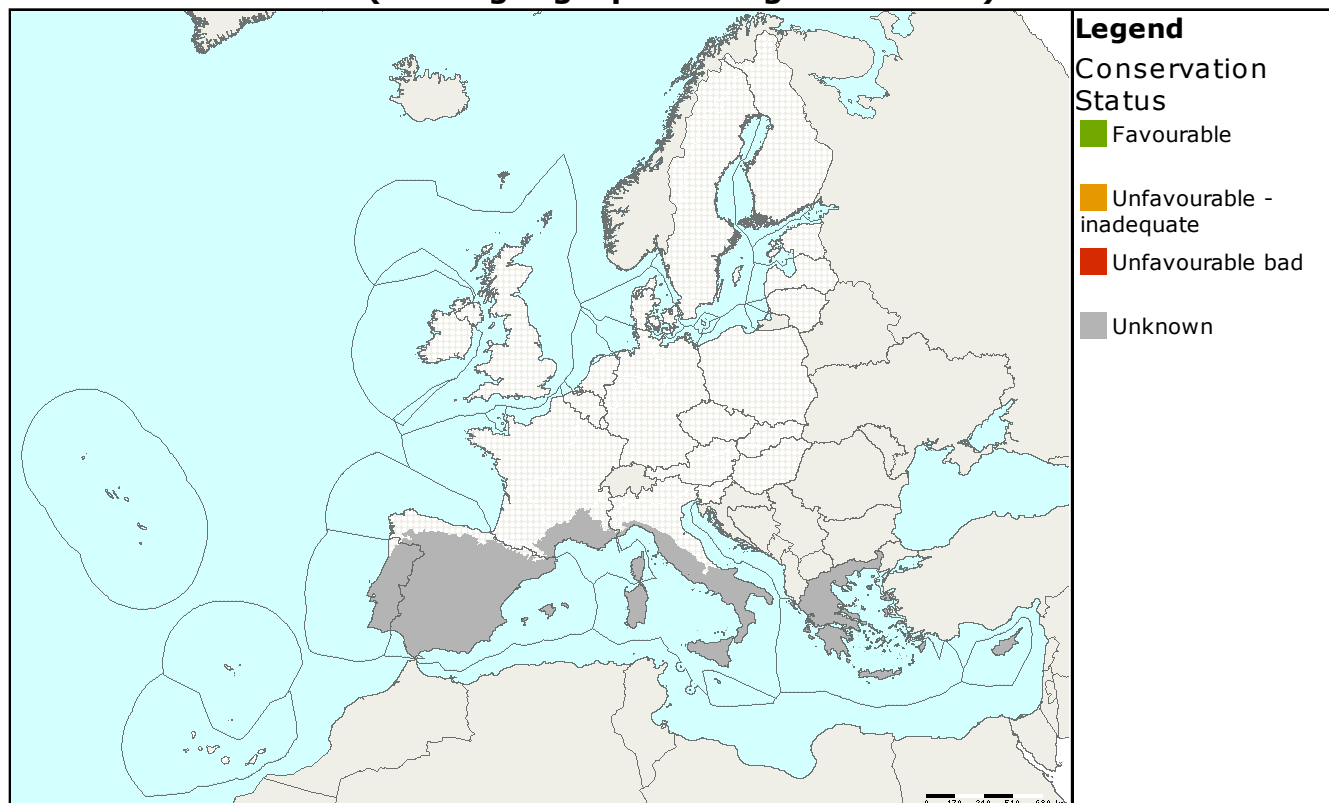

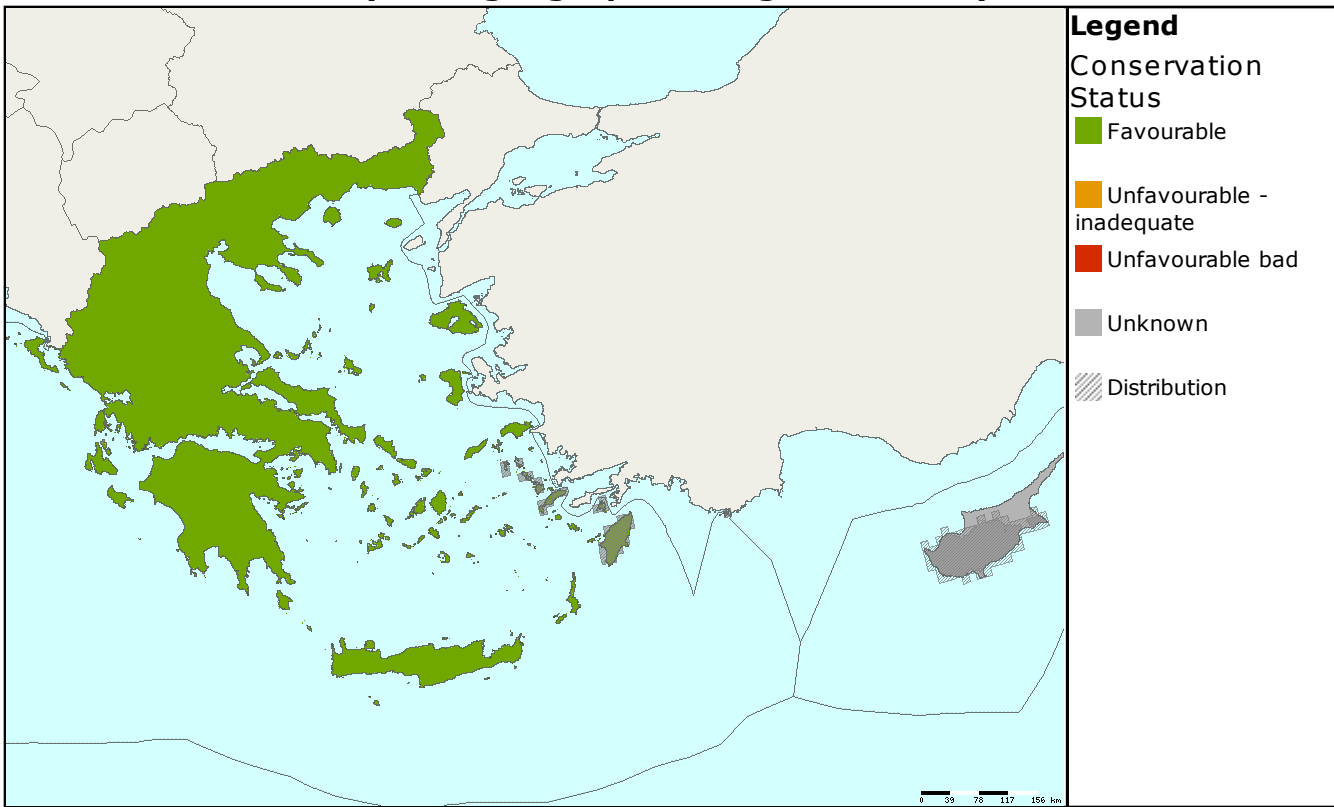
## Assessments of conservation status at the European level (all biogeographical regions - EU25)

*Coluber nummifer* is a snake species reported from the Mediterranean region by Greece and Cyprus. This harmless snake is frequently killed by people, due to its resemblance with the poisonous *Macrovipera lebetina* (blunt nosed viper). Greek report is 'favourable', but the species and its habitat in Cyprus are poorly known, therefore no data can be provided. However in the opinion of the local NGO FFEO the habitat of the species is being continuously deteriorated and so future prospects should be evaluated as 'unfavourable inadequate'. This would result in the 'inadequate' overall assessment at the national and as well at the biogeographical level. Overall assessment is currently 'unknown'.
