



The Pyrenean brook salamander or Pyrenean newt (*Euproctus asper*) is found in the Pyrenean mountains (Andorra, France and Spain). It is dependent on temperate forests which contain cold watery elements and sometimes caves. Due to lacking data from Spain its status in the Atlantic and Mediterranean region remain 'unknown'. However, the largest part of its range lies in the Alpine region (France and Spain) wherefore its overall status was assessed as 'bad'. According to the IUCN this species is decreasing due to the loss of habitat. Its conservation status is therefore 'Near Threatened'.
