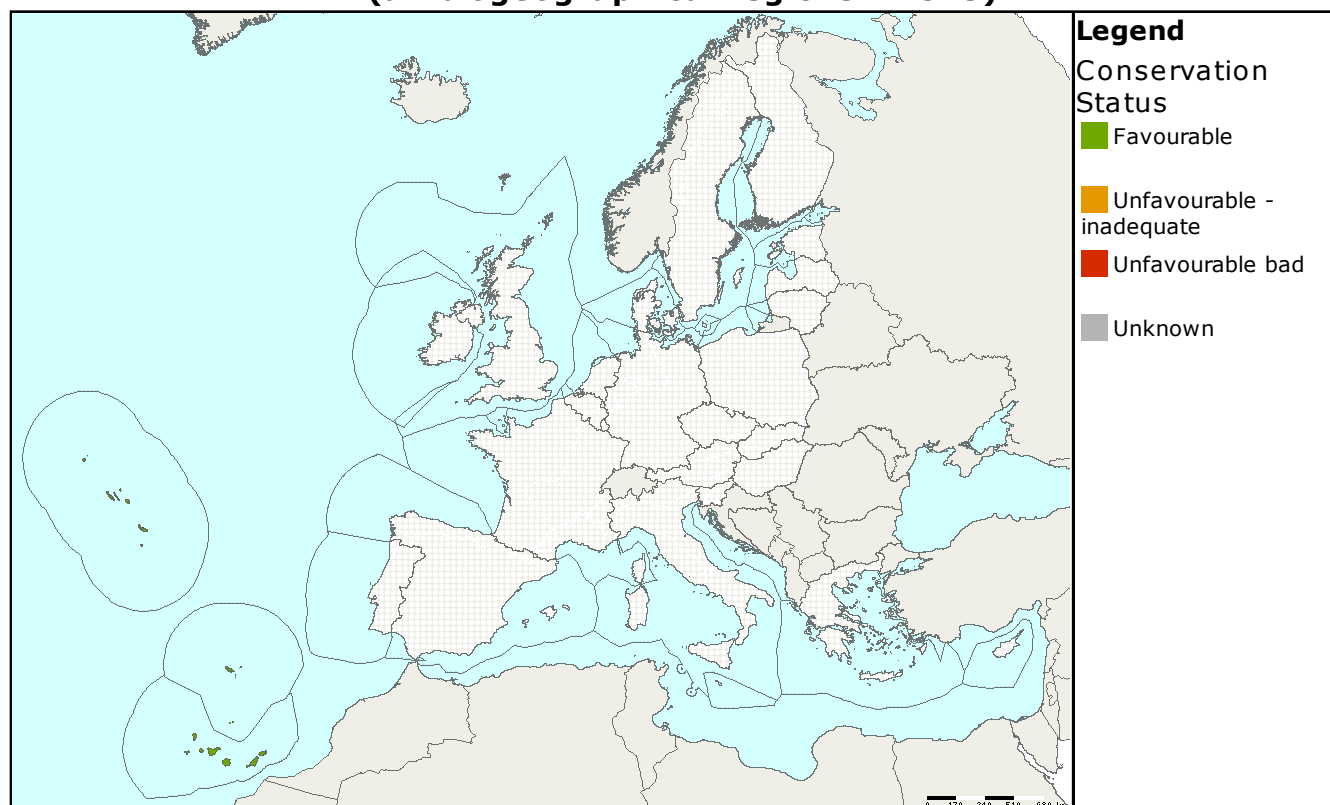

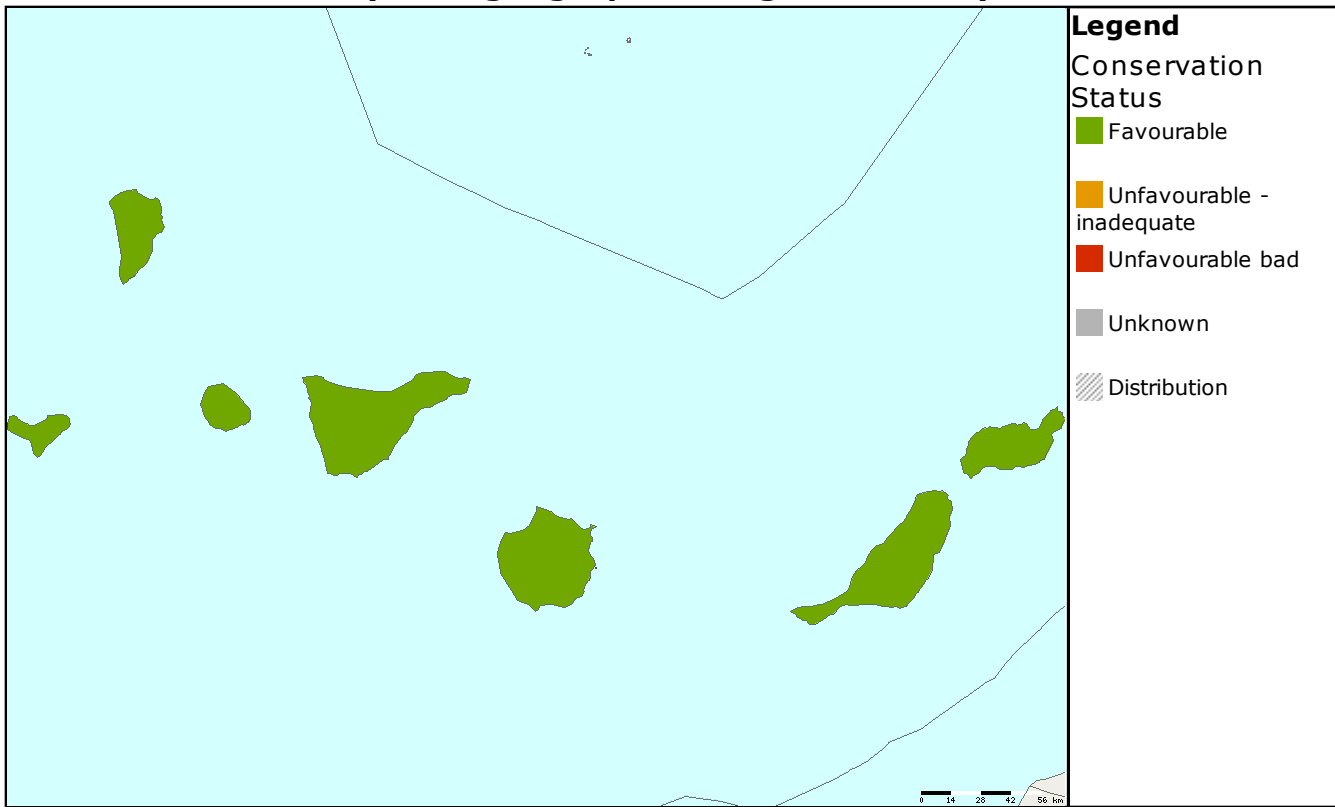

The Atlantic lizard is endemic to the Canary Islands, Spain. It is known from Lanzarote and Fuerteventura and surrounding small islets. It is found in a variety of dry, warm open habitats including cultivated and built up areas.

It occurs only in the Macaronesian biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'favourable'. The species is relatively common within its range and is not considered particularly endangered. Although the natural range is restricted, its populations are abundant and stable.
