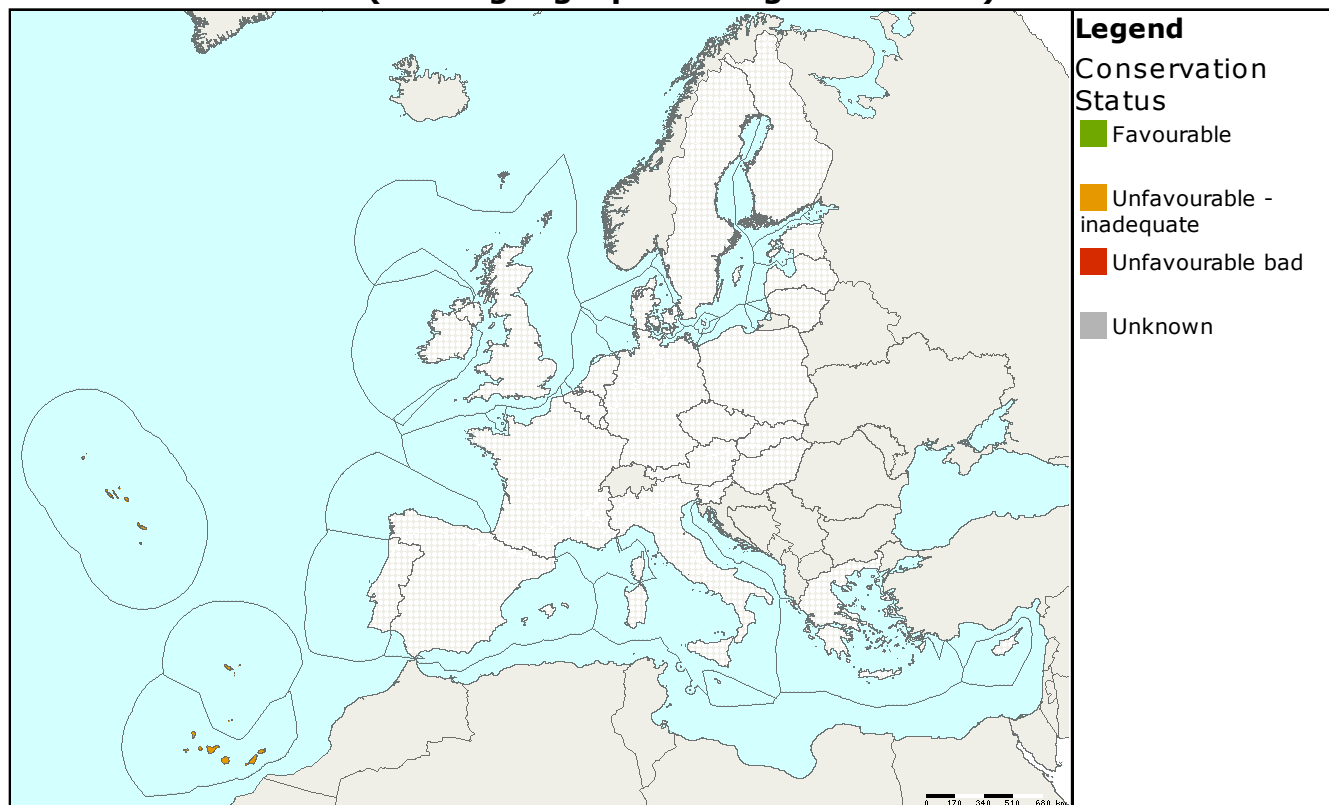

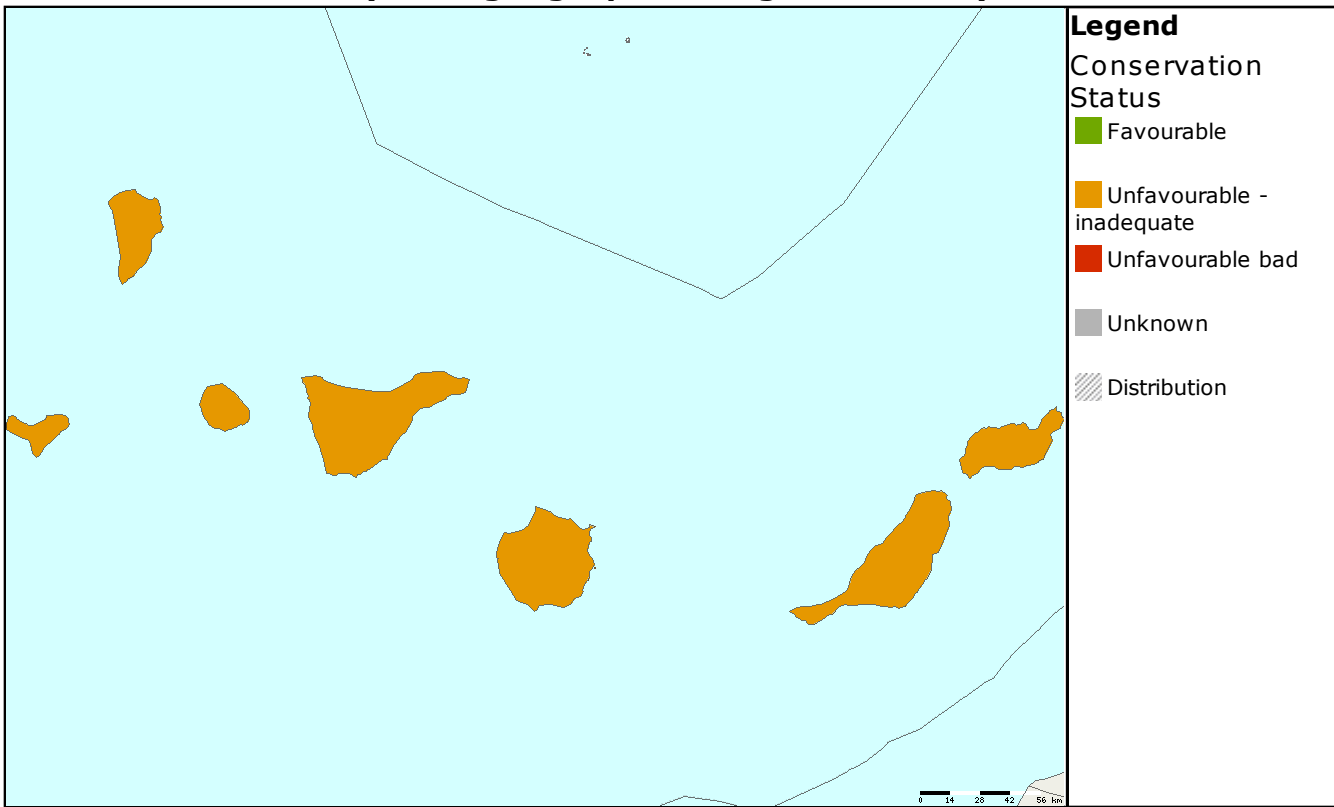

This subspecies of the Tenerife Lizard is endemic to the Canary Islands, Spain. It occurs only on the small islet of Roque de Fuera de Anaga close to Tenerife. It can be found in variety of habitats.

It occurs only in the Macaronesian biogeographical region. Its conservations status is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. The subspecies is considered 'near threatened' in Spain, largely because of its very restricted distribution.
