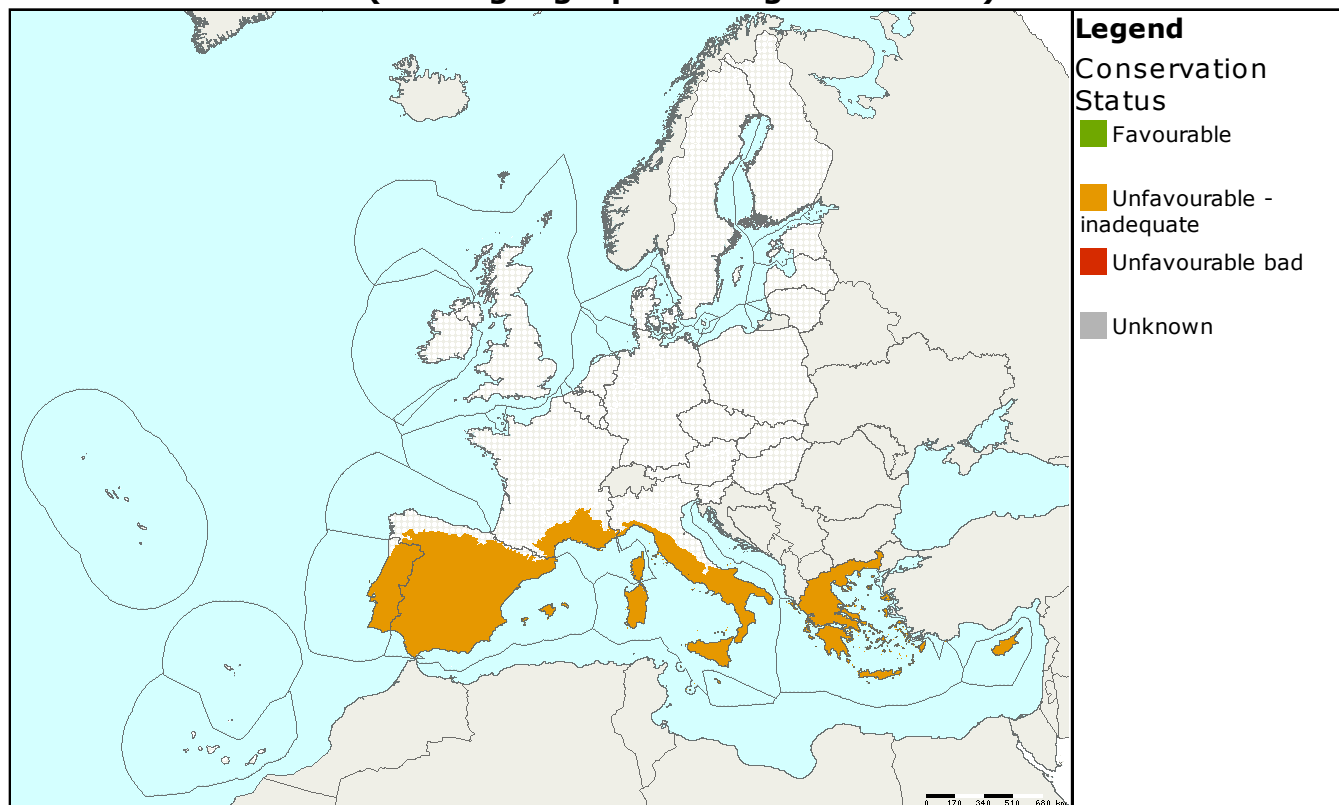

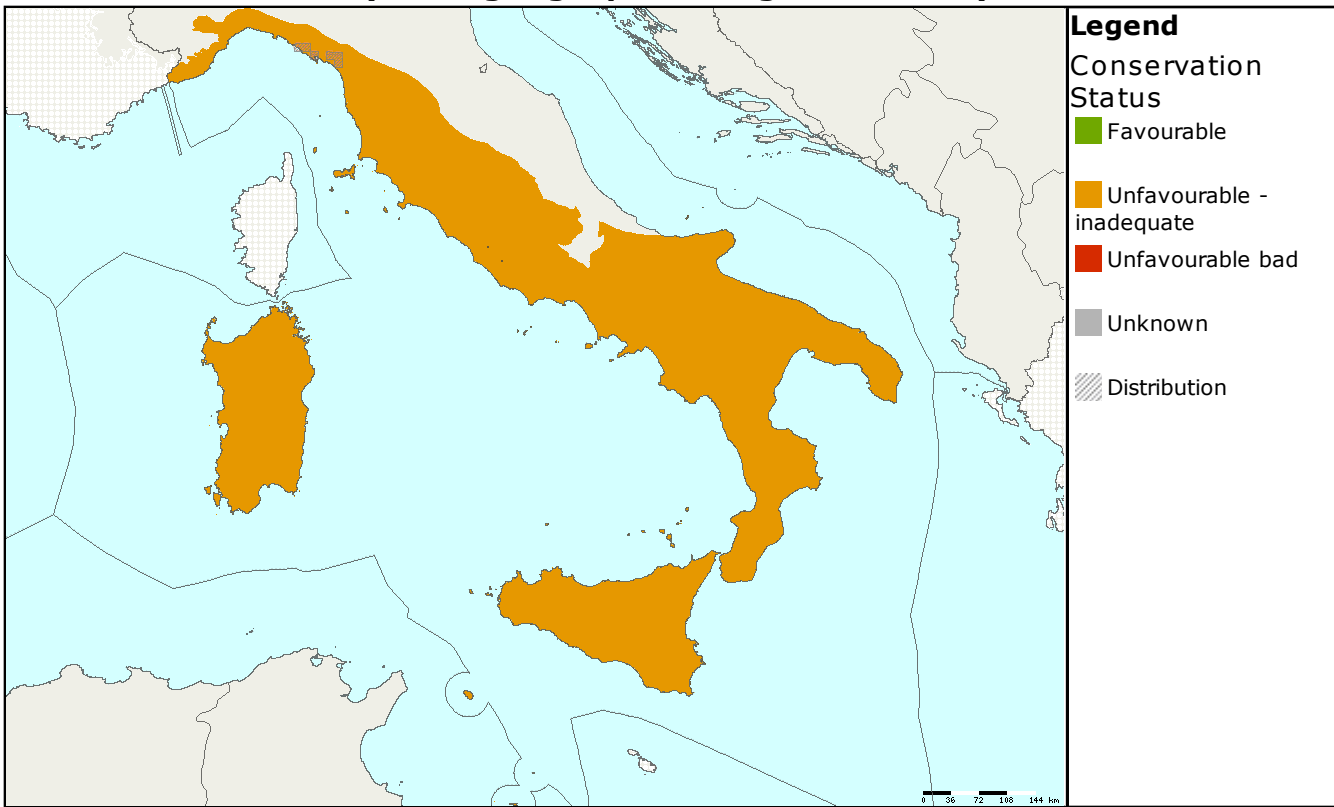

The ambrosi salamander is endemic to a small area of eastern Liguria and northern Tuscany in Italy. The species colonises a wide range of shaded habitats with high humidity such as chestnut forests, crevices in rocky cliffs and caves.

It was reported only from the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The species is relatively abundant within its restricted natural range and the status is 'unfavourable-inadequate', the range area and the quality of the habitat are not 'favourable'. It is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List as 'near threatened'.
