The French cave salamander only occurs in southeast France and northwest Italy. This salamander is dependent on habitats that contain caves, wherein it hides. At night it uses the caves' surroundings for hunting.

In all the geographical regions (Alpine, Continental and Mediterranean) this species has been assessed, its status is assessed as 'favourable'. However, in the Continental region it has the status of 'unknown', due to the Italian assessment. In general this species is not considered to be threatened, but it is important that key habitats (containing caves and forests) should be preserved in order to protect this species.


