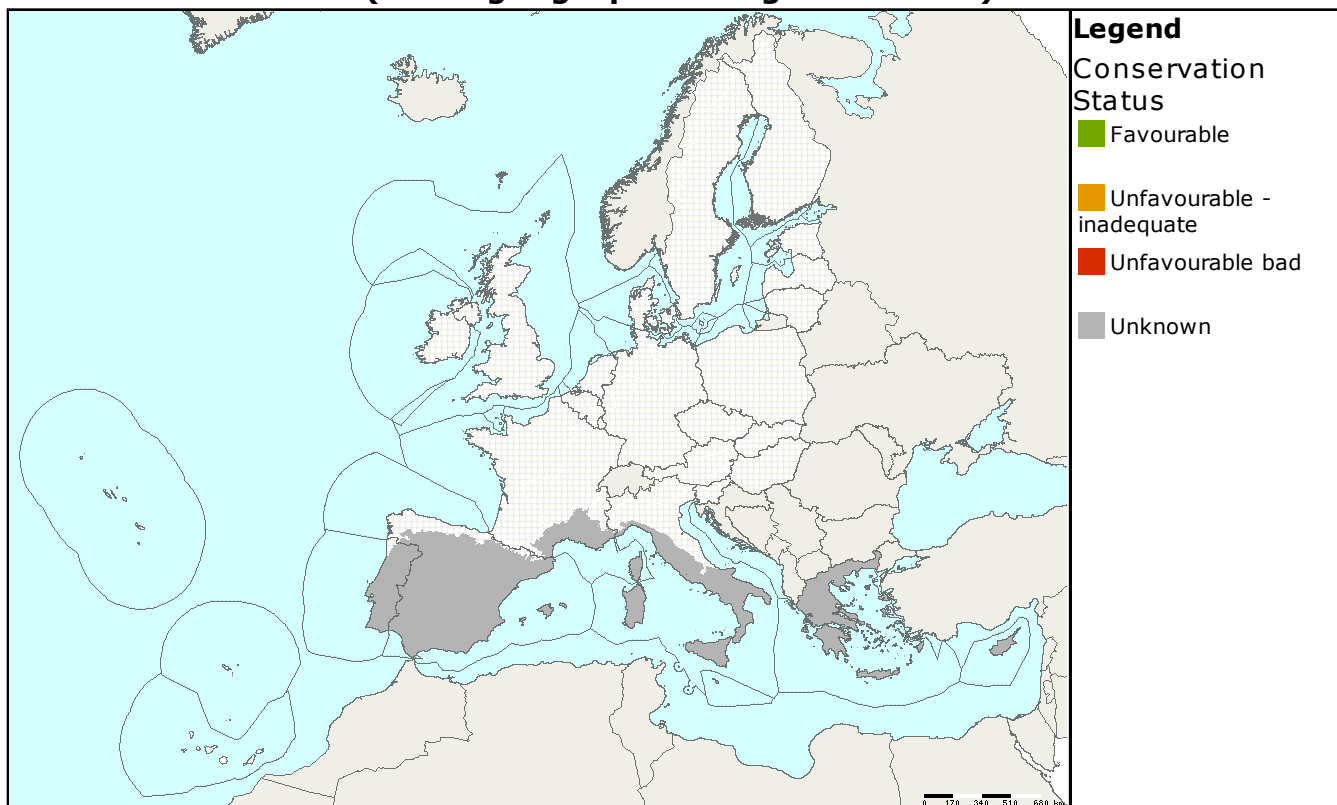

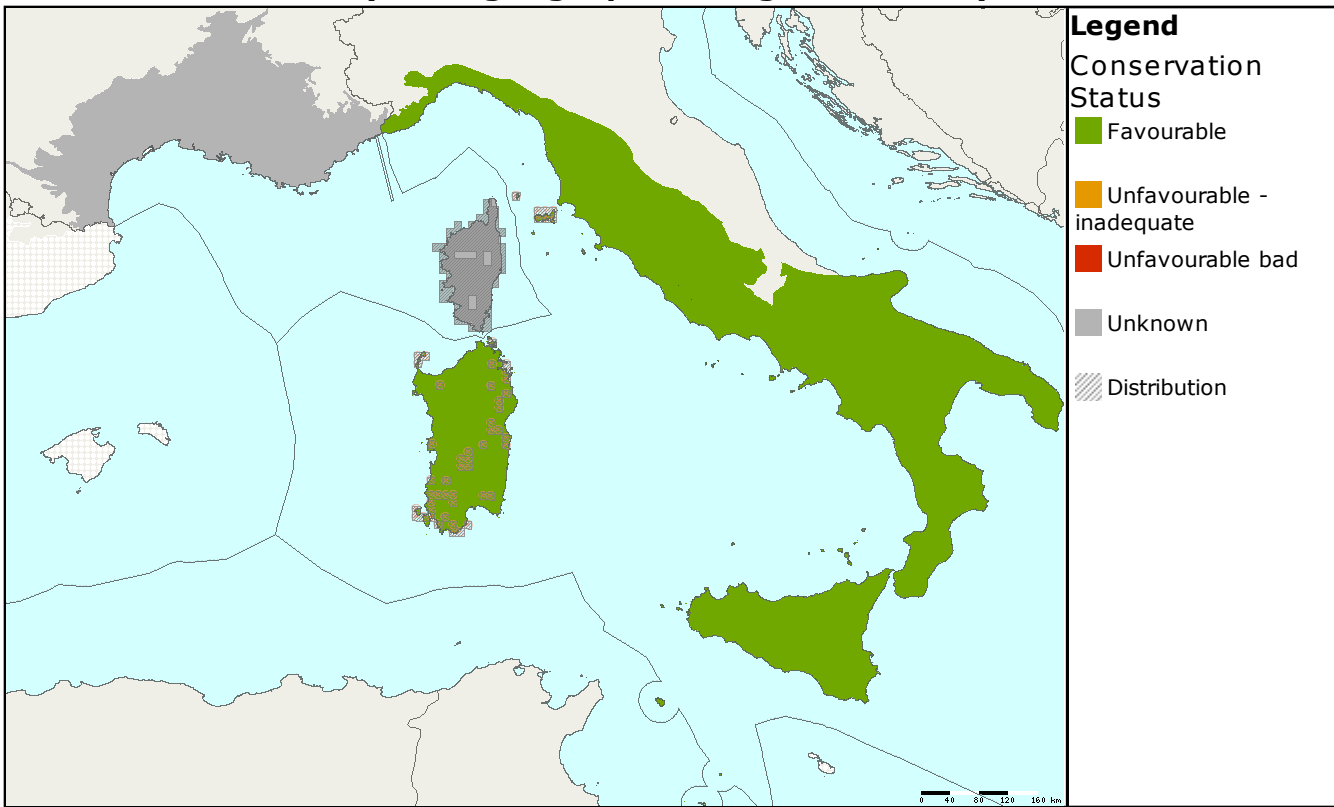

The Tyrrhenian tree frog is restricted to the Mediterranean Islands of Corsica (France) and Elba, Cavallo, Sardinia, Maddalena, Capra and San Pietro (Italy). Overall assessment for this species is 'unknown'. Italian report is however 'favourable', with only habitat parameter reported as 'unknown'. According to IUCN the species is considered as 'least concern'.
