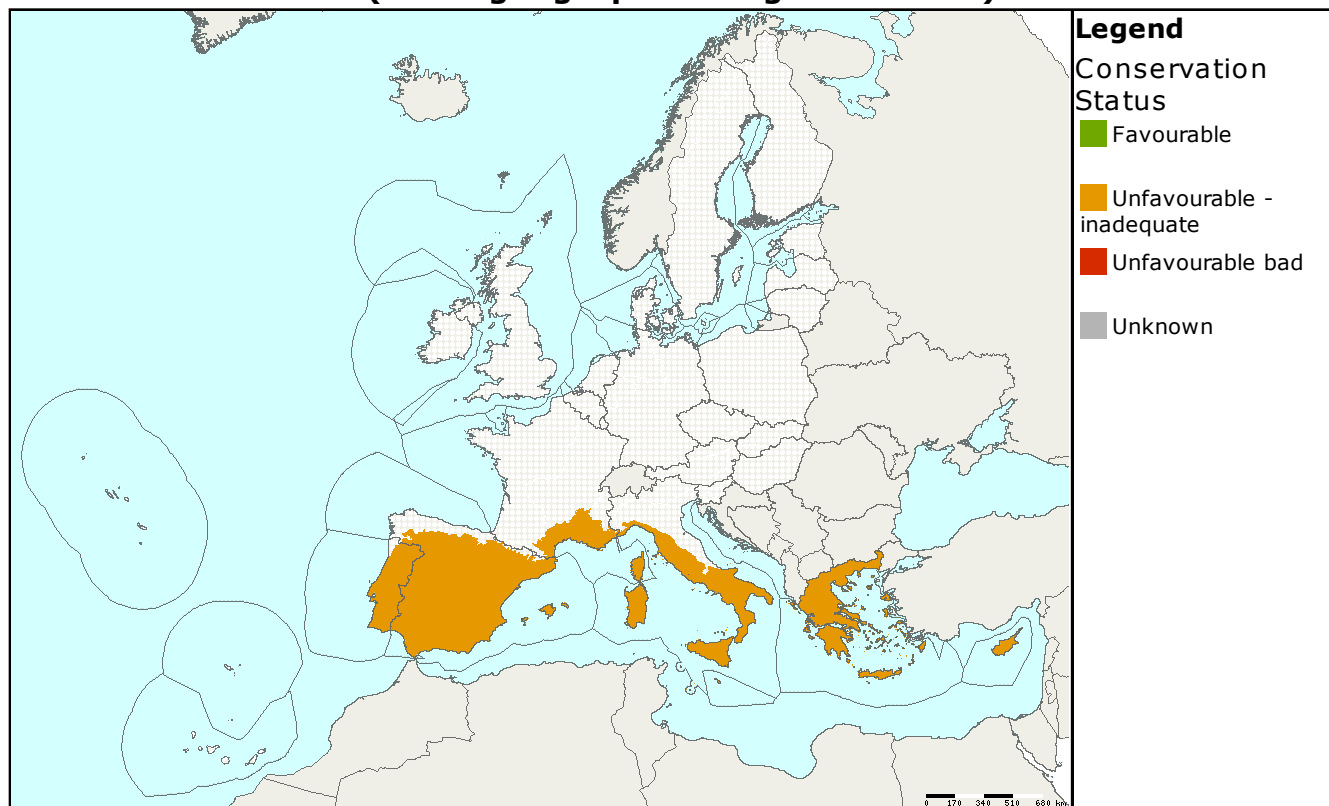

The Anatolian rock lizard occurs in Turkey and in Somos, one of the western Aegean Greek islands. It occurs mainly on rocky slopes with open woods, shrubs, pastures or olive groves.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The population size is decreasing due to fires and human induced changes of habitat and so the conservation status was assessed as 'unfavourable-inadequate'.
