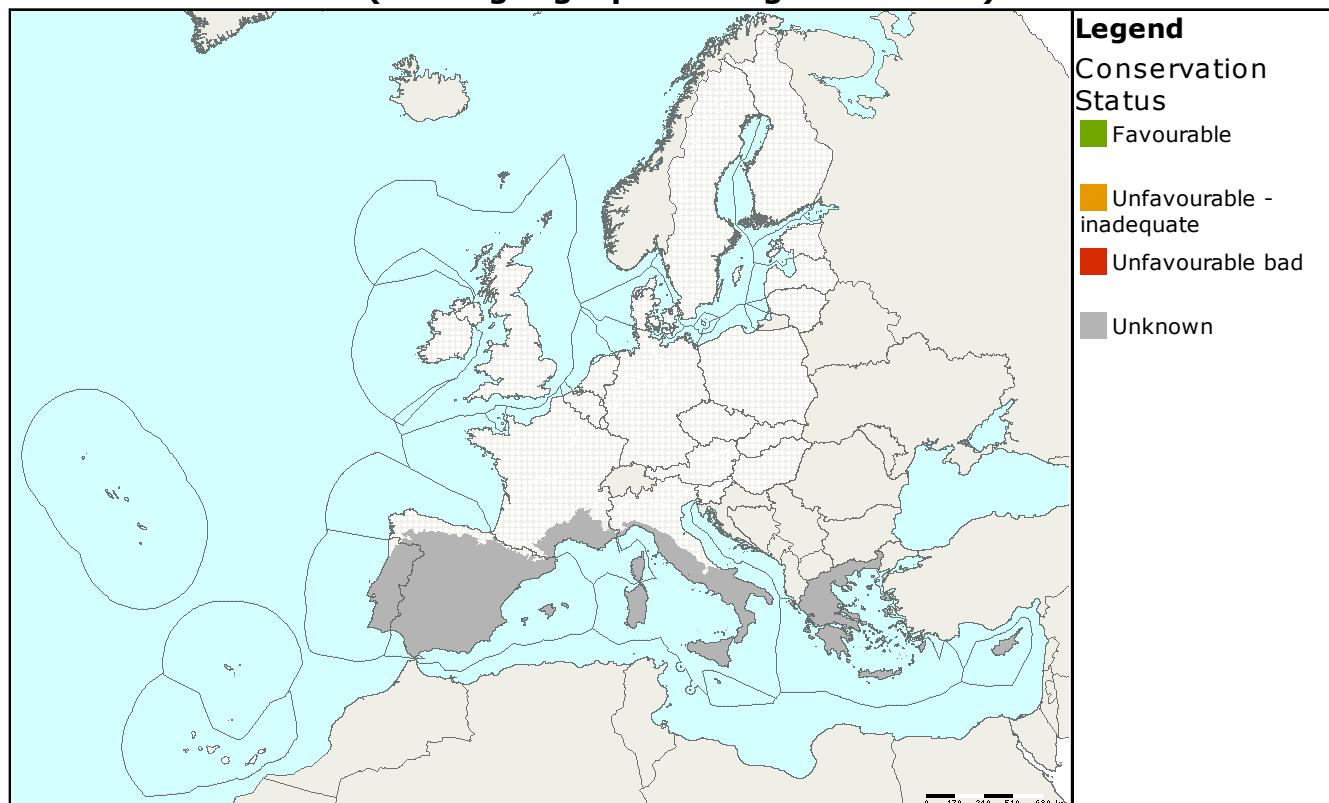

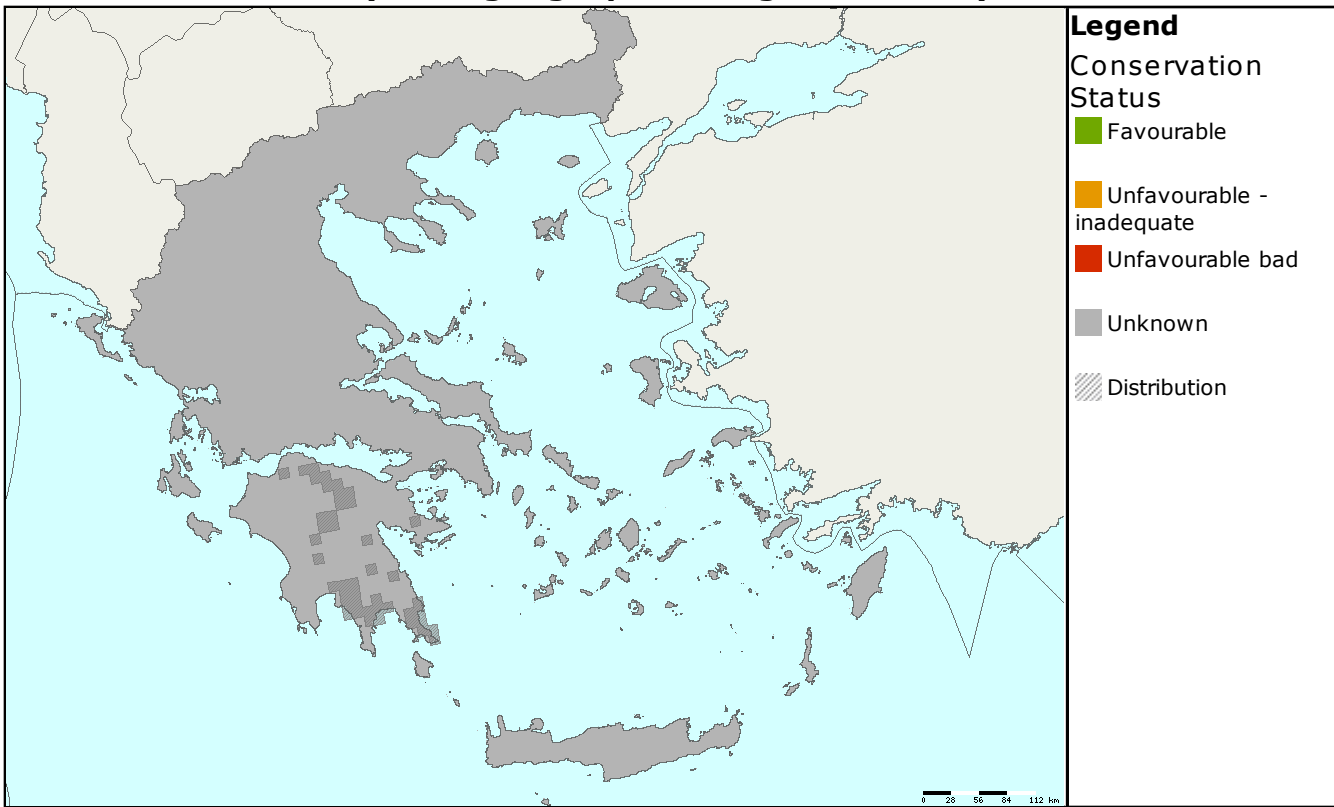

The Greek rock lizard is endemic to the Peloponnese Peninsula in southern Greece. It can be found on relatively humid and shaded stands in variety of habitats for example in open forests, hedges and shrub vegetation.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region where the conservation status is 'unknown'. However the species is noted as 'near threatened' in the 2008 IUCN Red List. Its distribution is restricted and a continuous decline of population size has been recorded in the last years suggesting the conservation status cannot be 'favourable'.
