



The Dalmatian wall lizard ranges from north-eastern Italy, through south-western Slovenia, coastal Croatia, southern Bosnia-Herzegovina, coastal Montenegro to north-western Albania. It is present on many Adriatic islands. It is found in dry open woodland, scrub, pastures and overgrown areas. It can be found on cliffs, rocks and stone walls. The species is only reported by Italy and Slovenia and its overall status of conservation is assessed as "unfavourable-inadequate" with all parameters reported as "unknown" by Italy. Listed as Least Concern" by IUCN in view of its wide distribution, tolerance of a degree of habitat modification and presumed large population.
