



The Mediterranean tree frog is naturally distributed is in the western Mediterranean. It can be found in trees, shrubs, orchards, vineyards, and grasses generally near to freshwater habitats.

There is insufficient information about this species to make an assessment for Alpine biogeographical region resulting in overall assessment being 'unknown'. Within the Atlantic biogeographical region species is recorded from Spain and France. All Spanish parameters are marked as insufficient. However, state of French population is unfavourable bad influencing overall assessment to be 'unfavourable-bad'. Same situation is in Continental biogeographical region (reported only in France). From Mediterranean biogeographical region species is recorded by Spain, France, Italy and Portugal. Only in France assessment is 'favourable'. Overall assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. According to IUCN species is considered 'least concern' with stable population.
