


The dice snake is a non venomous snake occurring in central and south-eastern Europe. It lives mainly near rivers, streams or lakes.

In the Alpine region there are different conclusions made in every country. More than 30% is 'unknown' but overall assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. In the Continental region overall assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate' despite unfavourable-bad conclusions reached in Austrian and German. These reports are affected by border effect and population in these countries are isolated. The report for Italy is 'favourable'. For Pannonian region conclusion is 'unknown' based on Hungarian report. However, other two national reports (Czech Republic and Slovakia) are 'unfavourable-inadequate'. Same conclusion is for Mediterranean region where more information is needed for next report.
