



The Eastern Spadefoot is a frog occurring from the Balkan Peninsula through Asia Minor to the Caucasus region. Within the EU it is also present in Romania and Bulgaria. It lives in soil in forested, steppic and semi-desert areas.

The conservation status is 'unfavourable inadequate', the species is on decline in the Mediterranean region, the only regions where it was reported. It is threatened due to loss of suitable habitats mainly the breeding sites.
