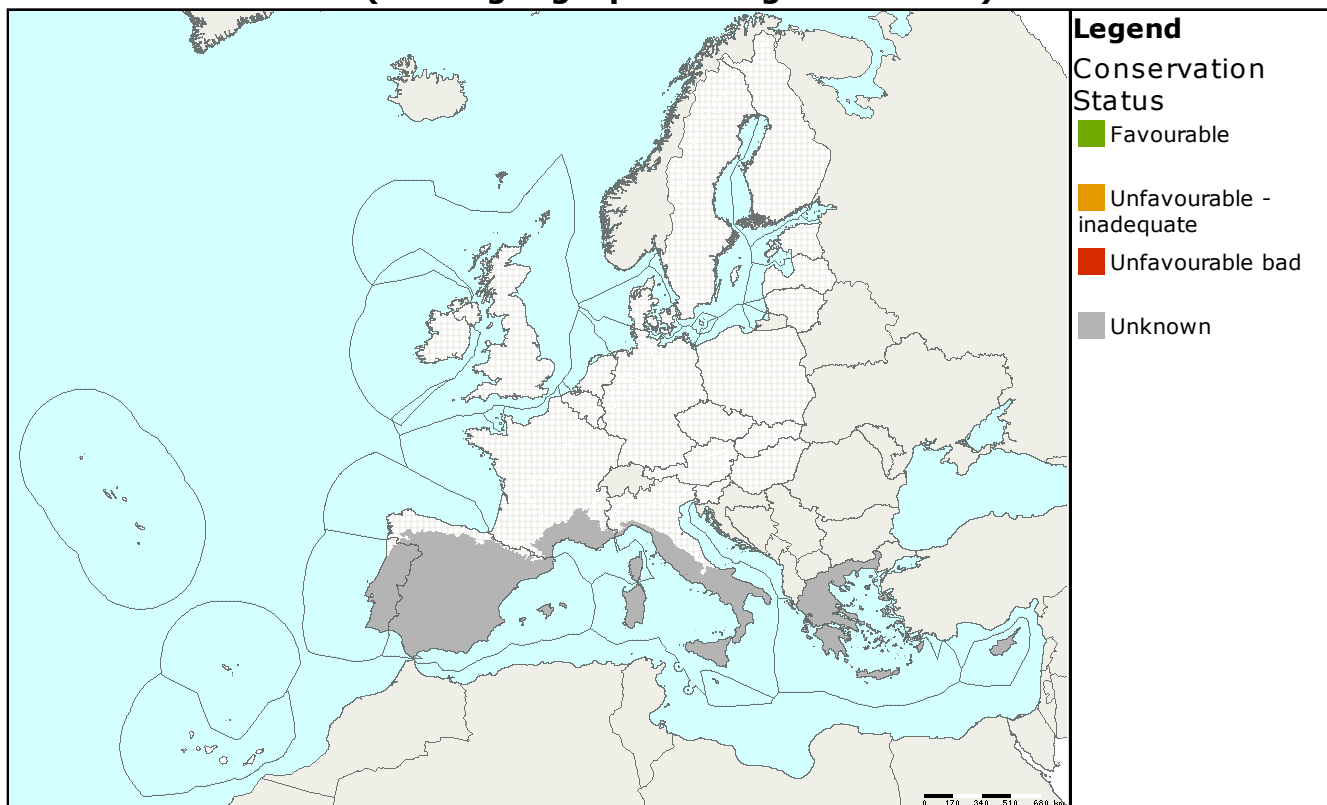

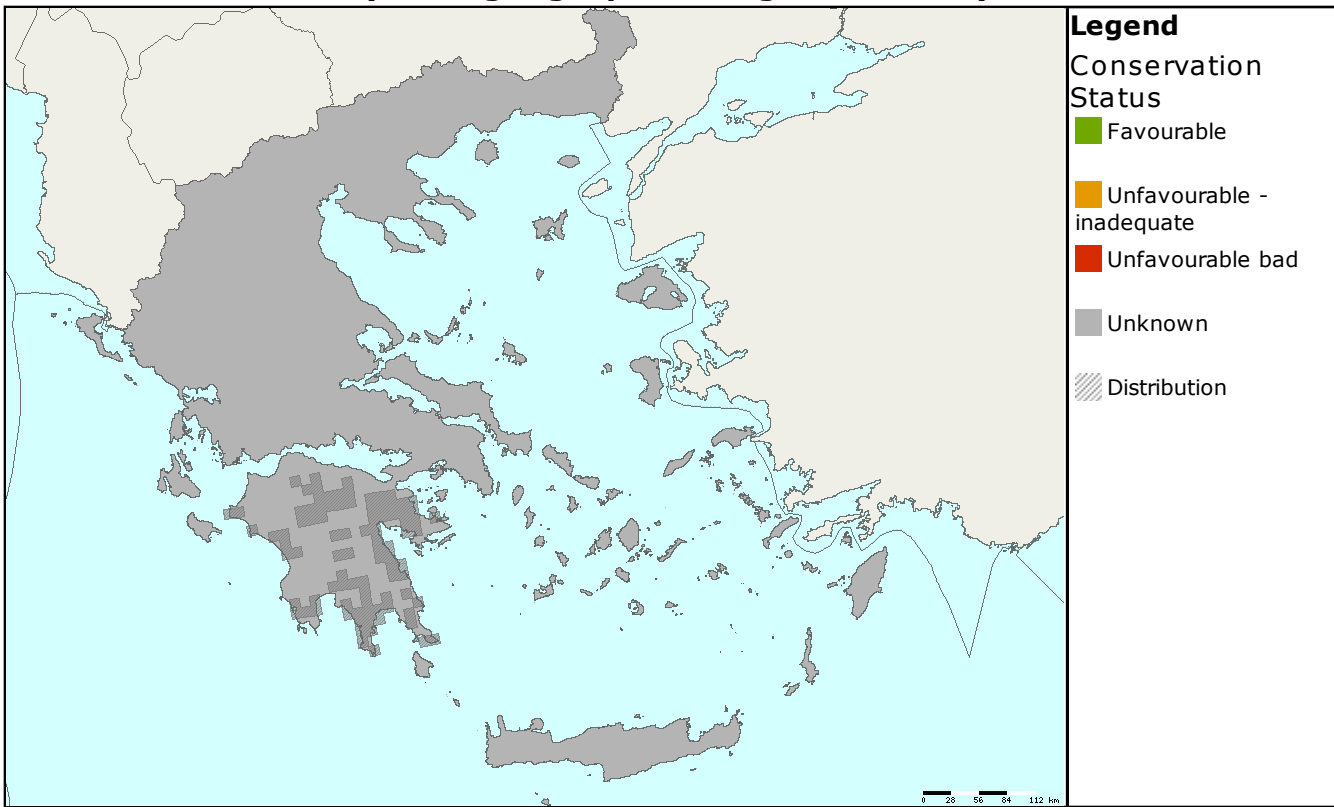

The Peloponnese Wall Lizard, is endemic to the Peloponnese Peninsula in the southern part of the continental Greece. The range estimate is based on the published data, but the actual range is probably larger. The species inhabits various natural or cultural mostly warm and dry habitats, like rocky slopes with shrub vegetation, olive groves or vineyards.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'unknown'. The information on the status of this species and on the threats is incomplete. The species is not considered to be particularly endangered, and within its range it is relatively common. It is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List in the category 'least concern'.
