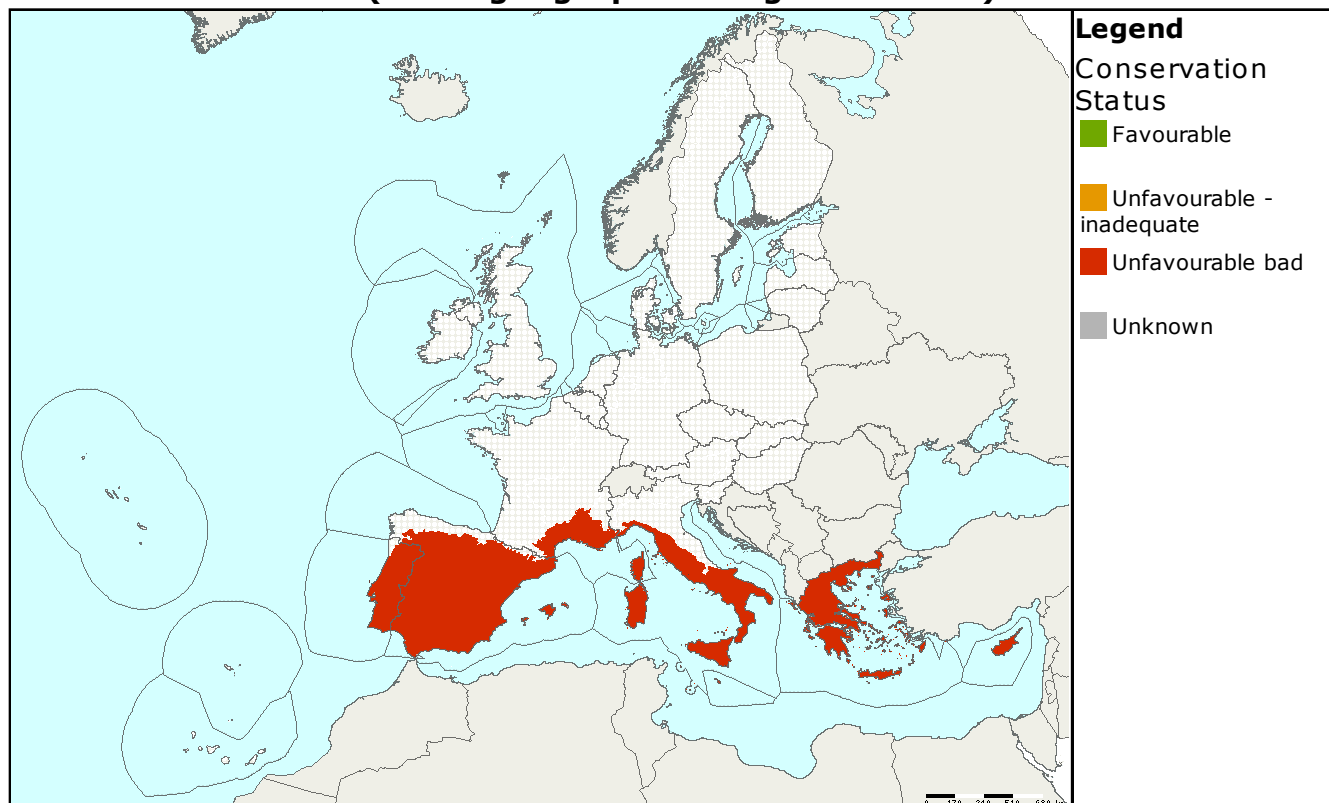

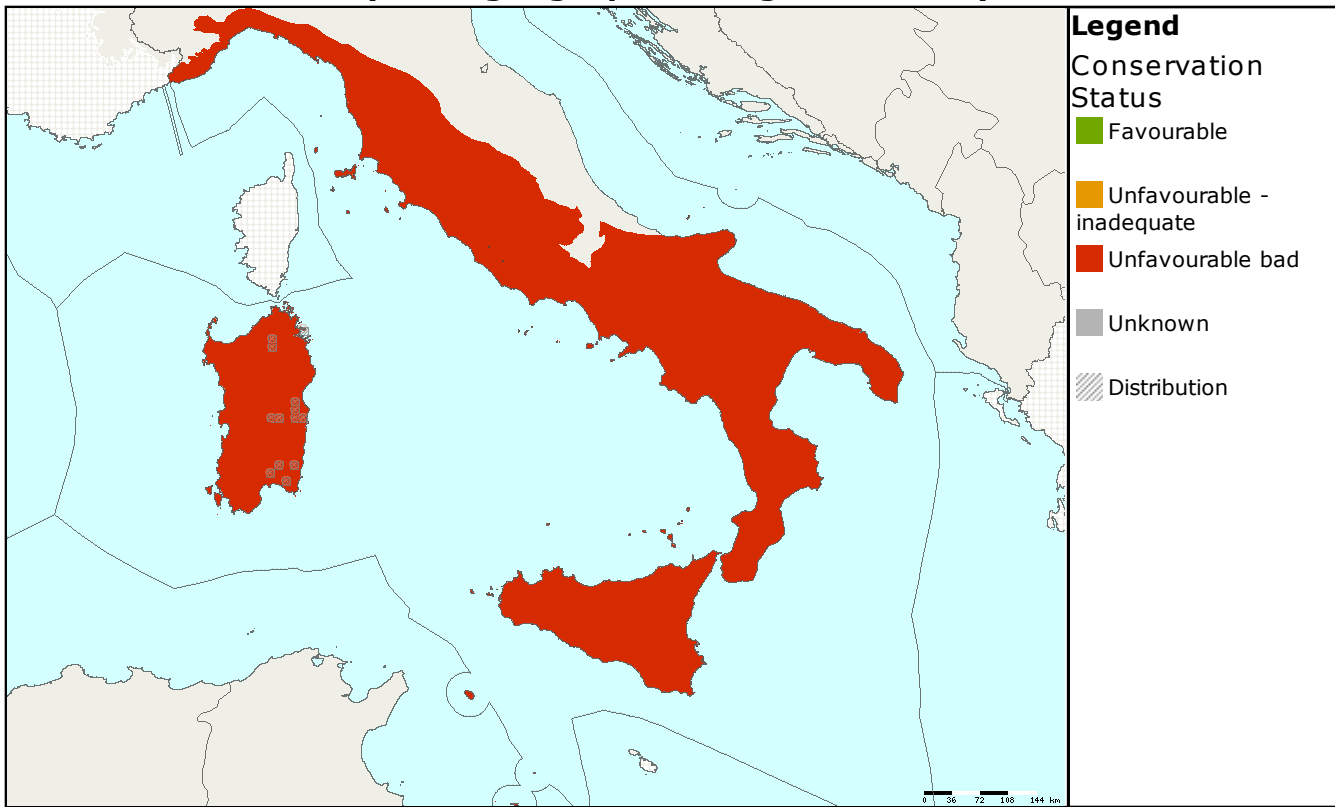

The Sardinian brook salamander is endemic to Sardinia, Italy, where it is mostly found in the eastern part of the island. It is a mountain species. It can be found in permanent or temporary, still or flowing waters and in surrounding riverine shrubs and woodlands.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'unfavourable inadequate'. The species distribution is restricted and it occurs only in few fragmented populations. Its range, population size and area of habitat are decreasing. It is listed in 2008 IUCN Red List as 'endangered'.
