Previously a subspecies of the Iberian Wall Lizard, now widely accepted as unique species. It is endemic to uninhabited Columbretes islands in the Mediterranean Sea of Spain. The particular habitat of the species is unknown, but as the other lizards it inhabits rocky slopes or rock outcrops.

It was reported only from the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'unknown'. The information on the status of this species and on the threats is scarce. The distribution of the subspecies is very restricted. That is why it is considered 'vulnerable' in Spain.


