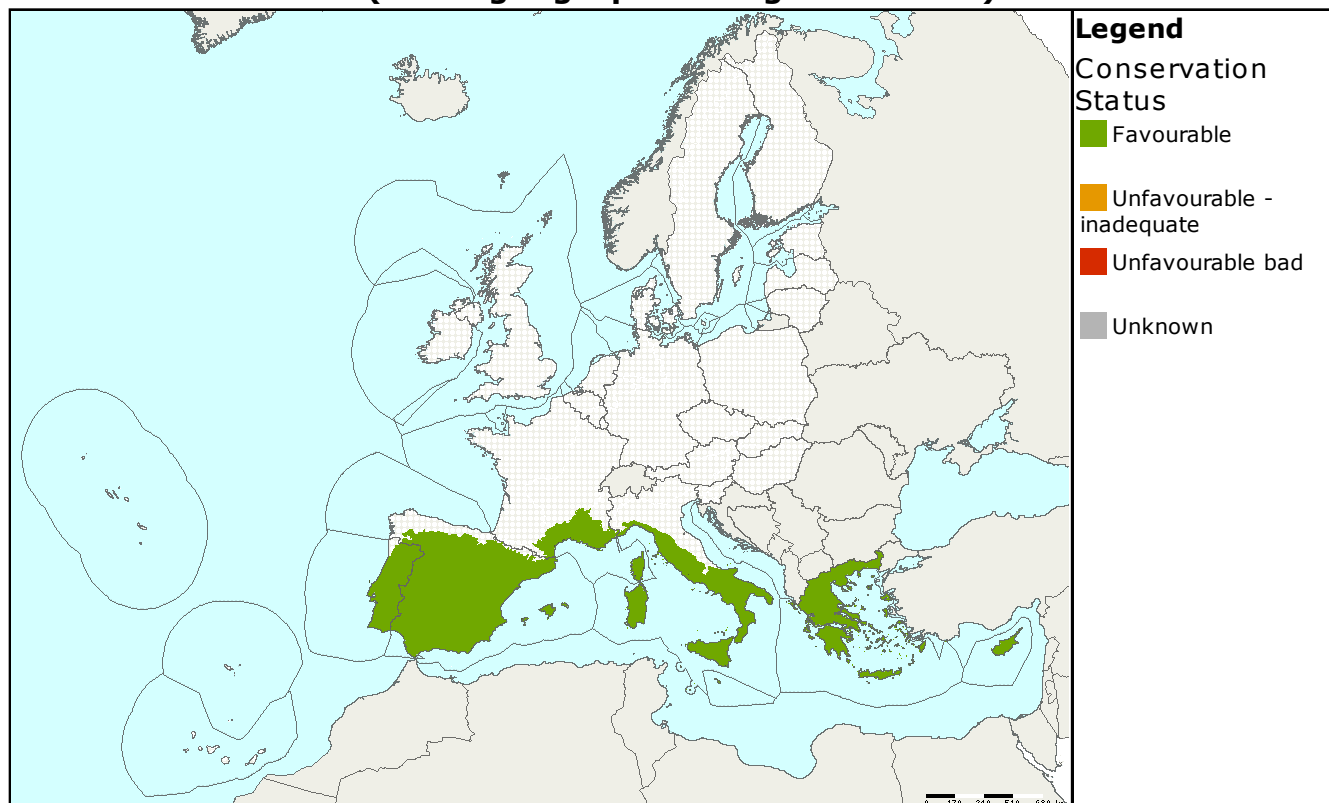

The Lilford's Wall Lizard is endemic to the Balearic Islands, Spain. The distribution of the species is restricted to the coastal islets of Menorca and Mallorca and Cabrera Archipelago. It occurs on dry rocky slopes covered by bushes.

The species occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'favourable', range and population size are stable and no major threats were recorded. However the distribution of the species is very restricted and fragmented. Mainly for these reasons it is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List in the category 'endangered'.
