



The Ibiza Wall Lizard is endemic to Ibiza and Formentera islands and their coastal rocky islets, Balearic Islands, Spain. It was introduced to Mallorca and to some other places in the continental Spain. It inhabits various natural and cultural, mostly warm and dry habitats with the shrub cover.

It occurs only in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservation status is 'unknown'. The information on the status of this species and on the threats is incomplete. However the status of the populations inhabiting the main islands is favourable. A number of the populations found on islets are also in decline. The species is included in the 2008 IUCN Red List in the category 'near threatened', mainly due to its restricted occurrence.
