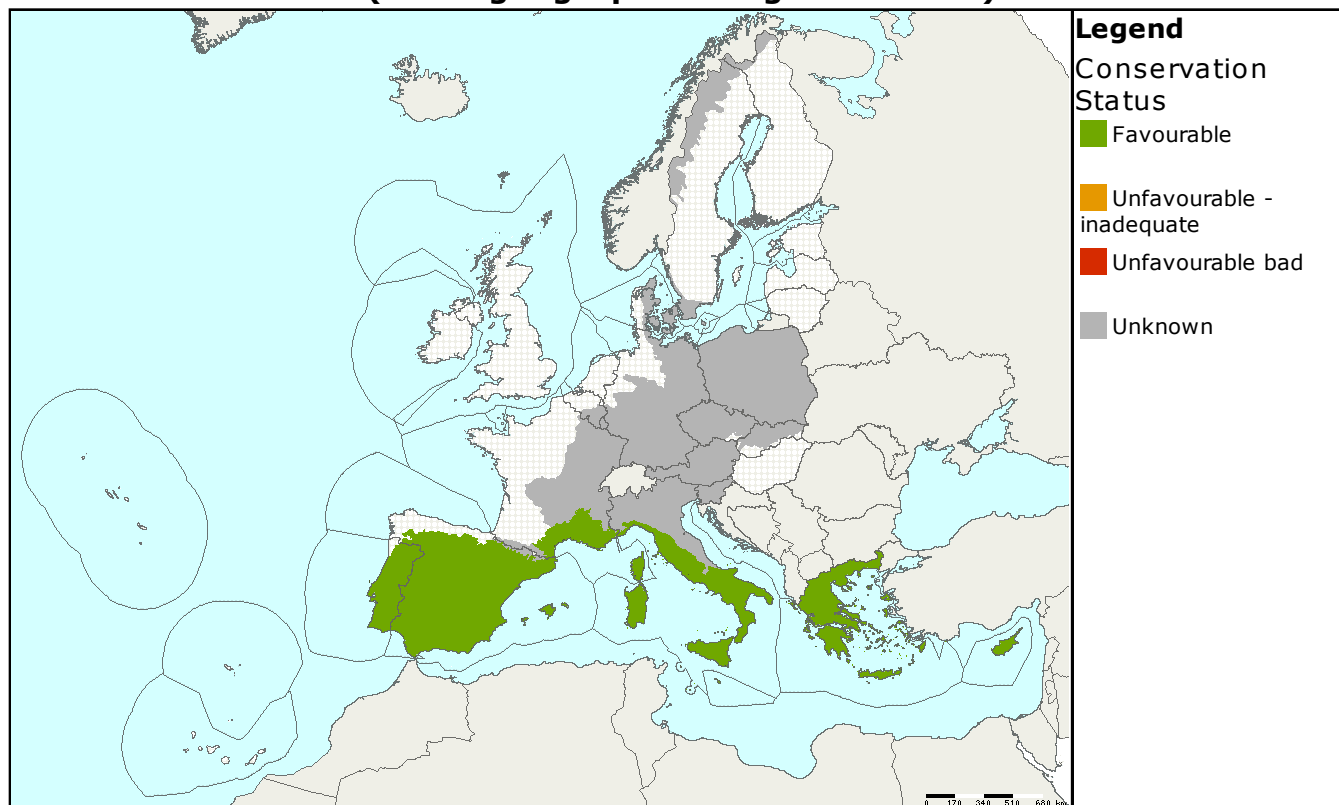

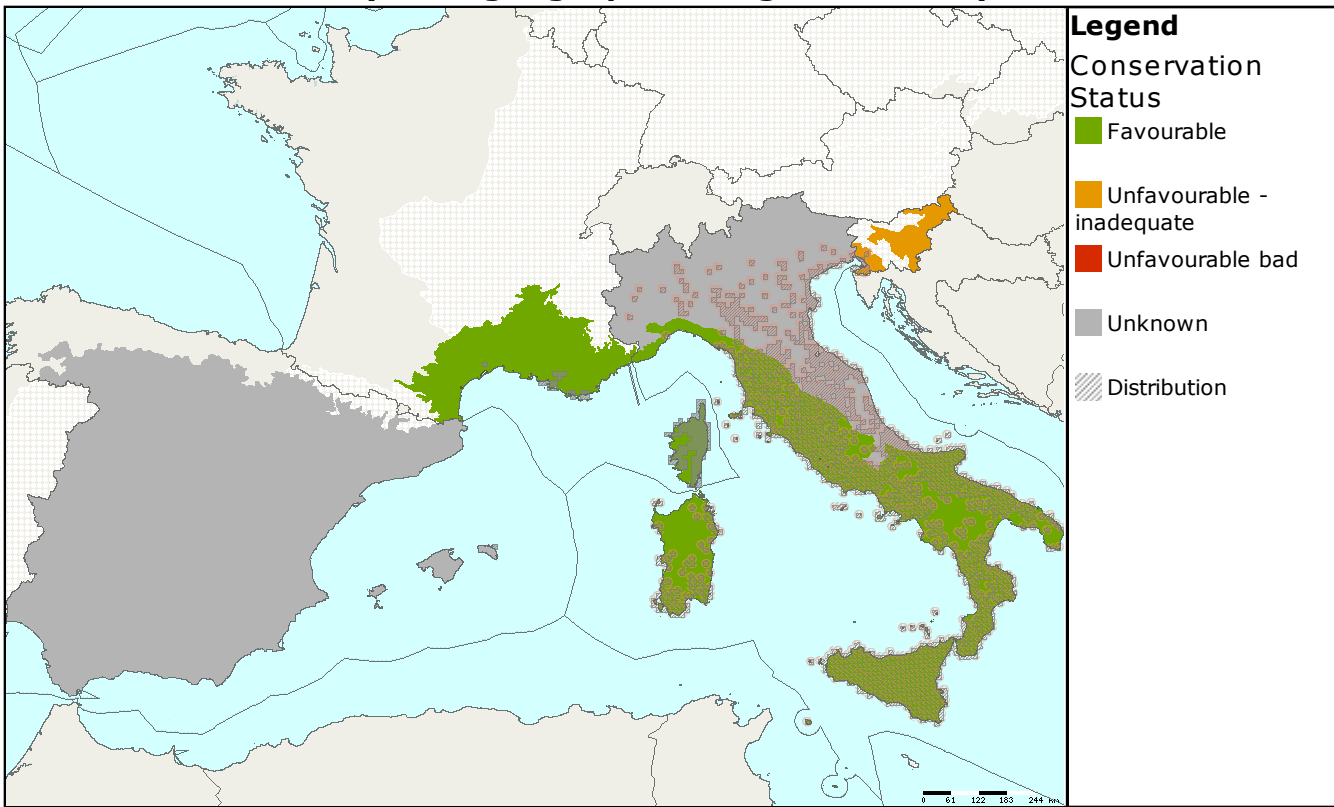

The Italian wall lizard is found in many southern European countries, ranging from Spain to Turkey. It is a species without a specific habitat preference. It is found in temperate forests and shrublands, different types of grasslands, rocky areas and urban areas. The overall assessment of this species resulted in an 'unknown' status for the Alpine and Continental region, which is mainly due to the Italian data. In the largest share of this species habitat, which is the Italian part of the Mediterranean region, its status has been assessed as 'favourable'. The IUCN conservation status of this species is 'Least Concern'.
