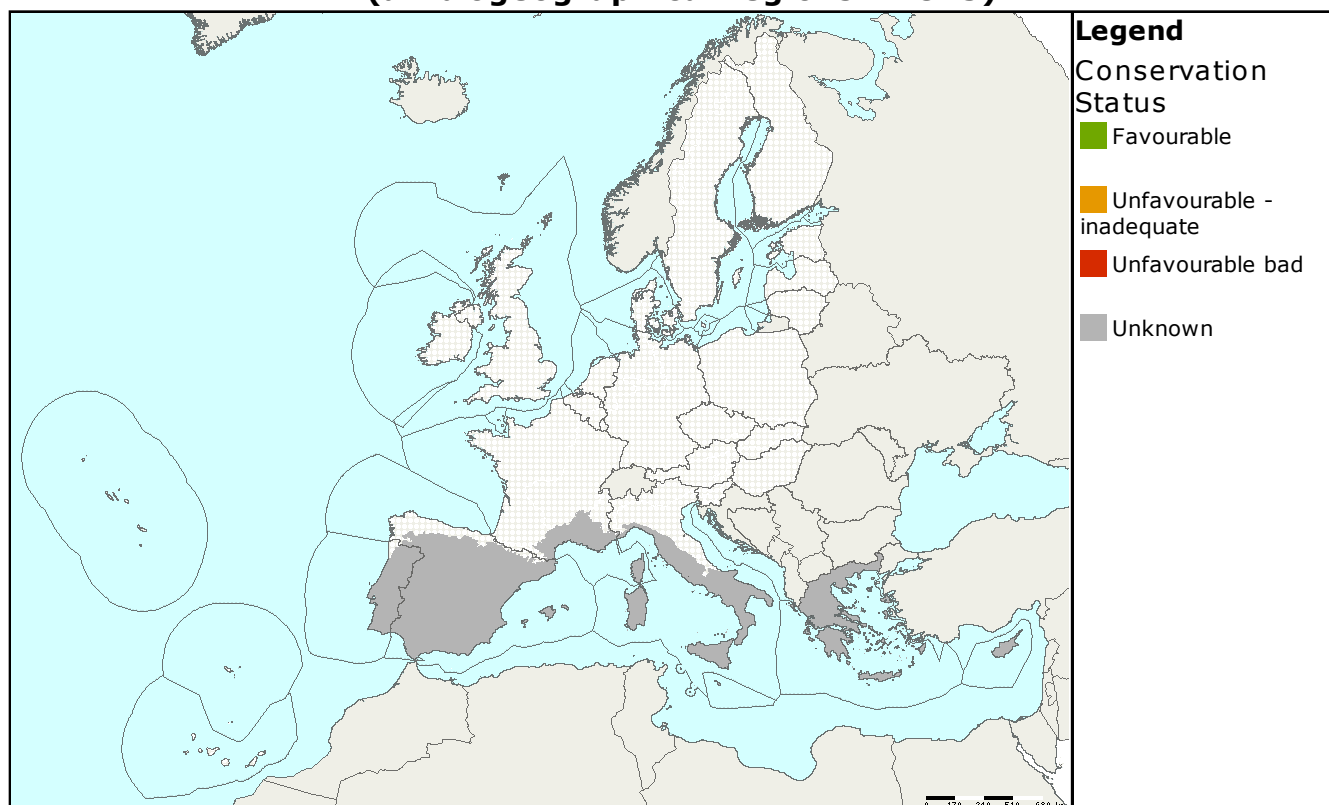

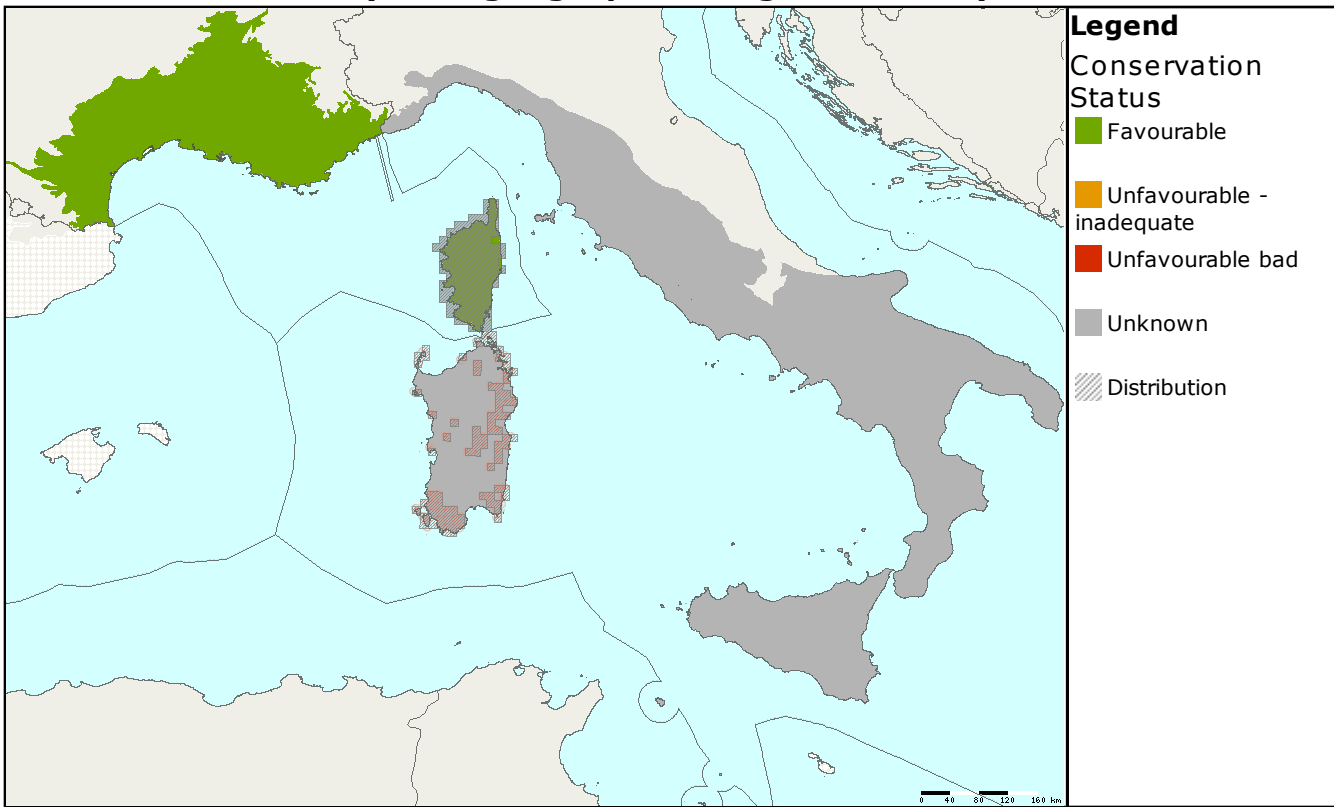

The Tyrrhenian wall lizard is a species occurring in the Mediterranean region in France and Italy. It is found in arid areas of scrubland, maquis, rocky areas, scree, open woodland, field edges, sandy coastal places with vegetation and occasionally in traditionally cultivated fields. The overall assessment for the species is "unknown" because of the lack of data reported from Italy for range and future prospects parameters. The rest of parameters are reported as "favourable" by both countries. The species is listed as "Least Concern" by IUCN in view of its relatively wide distribution and presumed large population. The species is not threatened as a whole, but insular populations are potentially threatened by introduction of predators or overcollection.
