



The Limbless Skink occurs in southern Greece and in south-western Turkey. The range is estimated, being based upon published data, but it is expected to be larger. The skink is also known from several other islands in the Aegean Sea. It is associated mostly with open areas and it can be found mainly in grasslands.

The conservation status is 'unfavourable inadequate', which is due to the 'inadequate' status of future prospects. Other parameters are 'unknown'. The information on this in general poorly known species is incomplete.
