



The four-lined snake occurs in South Europe. This snake has a preference for wooded habitats, in particular the Mediterranean maquis, which is a bushy vegetation growing in a rocky and dry environment.

In all the geographical regions (Alpine, Continental and Mediterranean) where the species occurs its status has been assessed as 'inadequate'. In Slovenia it is doing badly. A very important range of this species' habitat is situated in Greece, wherefore the data are insufficient. More data are required in order to make a proper assessment of its status. A major threat to this species is destruction of its habitat by forest fires.
