



The Greek Stream Frog is wide spread, and locally relatively abundant, throughout the Balkan Peninsula. It is mainly an aquatic species, occurring in mountains often in small rivers and streams in forested areas.

It was only reported in the Mediterranean biogeographical region. The conservations status is 'favourable', range and population size are stable and no major threats were recorded.
