



The lanza's alpine salamander occurs only in a very small area of the western Alps on the border of Italy and France and in the northern Pyrenees. It is associated with rocky alpine meadows and scree slopes, often close to small streams, usually above the tree line. Its overall status of conservation is reported as "unfavourable-bad". The species is listed as "Vulnerable" by IUCN because it is known from fewer than five locations.
