



The spectacled salamander is endemic to southern peninsular Italy in the Apennine Mountains (where it is widespread) and other hilly areas, south of Caserta province (Campania region). It is mainly found in forests with dense undergrowth in hilly and mountainous areas. The overall assessment for the species in the three biogeographical regions where it appears is "unfavourable-inadequate". The species is only reported by Italy. The species is listed as "Least Concern" by IUCN in view of its relatively wide distribution.
