



The Spur-thighed tortoise is widely distributed around the Mediterranean, as well as Bulgaria and Romania. Outside the European Union it is known from the Middle East and North Africa. There is a large number of subspecies described. It is present as an introduction in Gibraltar (United Kingdom) and Malta but not reported. It is reported by Spain, Greece and Italy. All the parameters are reported as 'unknown' by Spain, although it is listed as 'endangered' in the national Red Data Book. Report is 'favorable' in Italy and 'unfavourable-inadequate' in Greece. Overall assessment is 'unfavourable-inadequate'. Better information required especially from Spain. According to IUCN the species is considered as 'vulnerable'.
