



The Hermann's tortoise occurs commonly in the southern and particularly in the south-eastern Europe. Apart from the area where it was reported it occurs commonly across all the Balkan Peninsula. Within EU it is present as well in Romania and Bulgaria. It inhabits wide spectrum of open Mediterranean habitats with warm and dry conditions in summer and mild in winner.

The conservation status in both the Mediterranean and the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate'. The species is on decline in most of the countries in the southern Europe. The status in the south-western part of the range is 'unfavourable bad', which is connected to the marginal and isolated character of the local populations.
