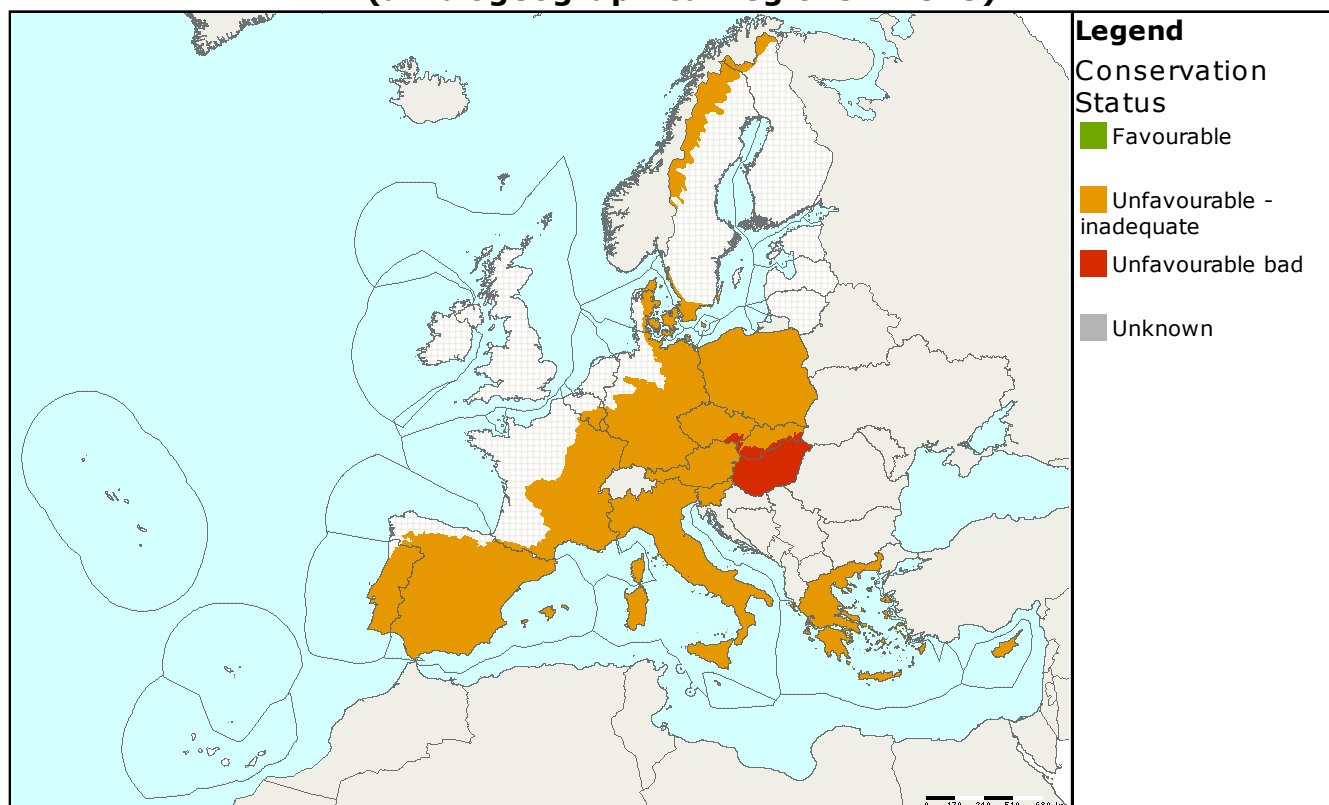

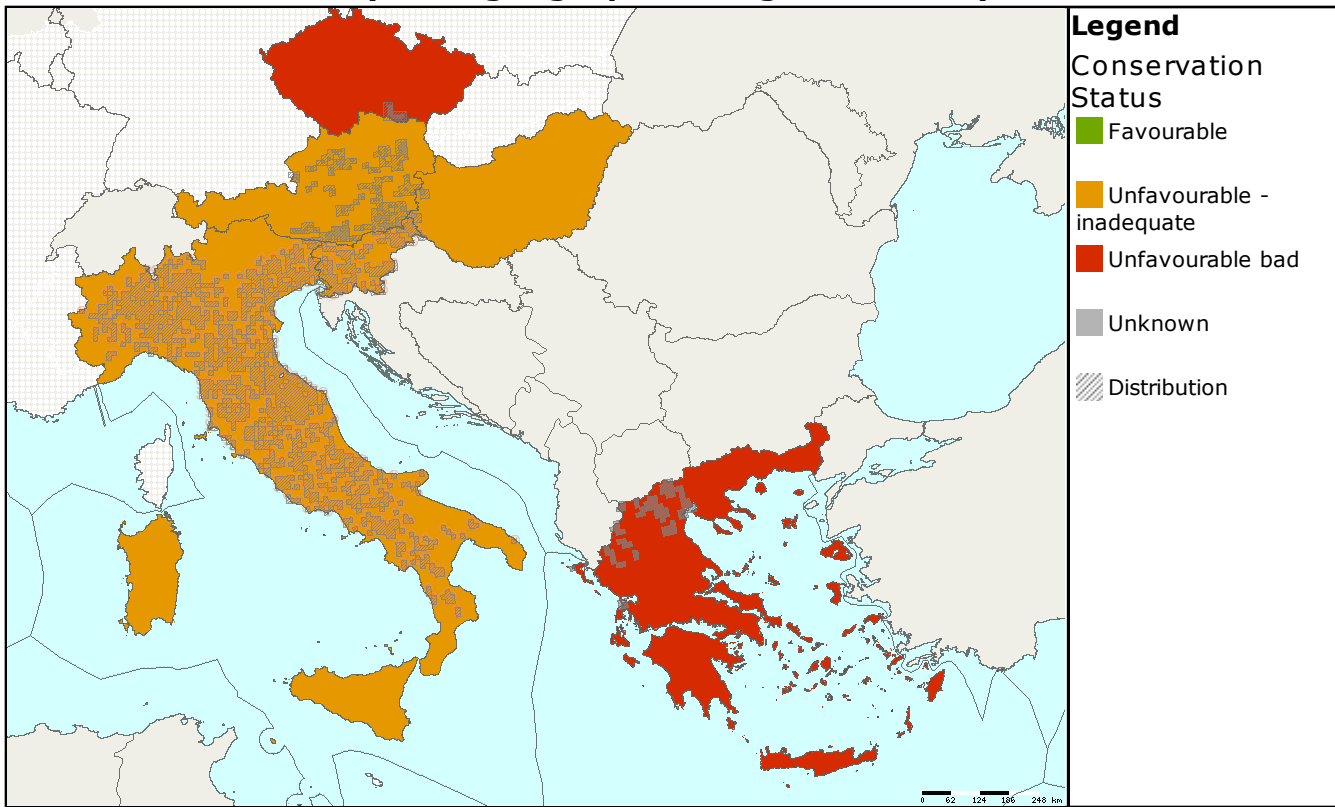

The Italian crested newt is distributed in south-eastern Europe. It uses wide variety of terrestrial habitats from Beech woodlands to arid Mediterranean climates. It can be found in modified habitats such as quarries.

From the Alpine bio-geographical region this species is recorded from Austria, Italy and Slovenia with overall assessment 'unfavourable-inadequate'. Within the Continental biogeographical region it is recorded by five countries with most assessments being also 'unfavourable-inadequate'. From Mediterranean biogeographical region species is recorded from Greece and Italy with regional assessment being the same as above. In Greece it is reported as 'unfavourable-bad'. From Pannonian biogeographical region species is reported by Czech Republic and Hungary. Overall assessment is 'unfavourable-bad'. According to IUCN the species is still 'least concern' but with decreasing population.
