



Anaecypris hispanica is a freshwater fish species, endemic of the Guadiana basin. It has an 'unfavourable-bad' conservation status in the Mediterranean region. Main threats include introduced fish species, extraction of sand and gravel, water pollution and hydraulic infrastructures like dams. According to IUCN species is considered as 'endangered' due to decline and fragmentation of its population.
