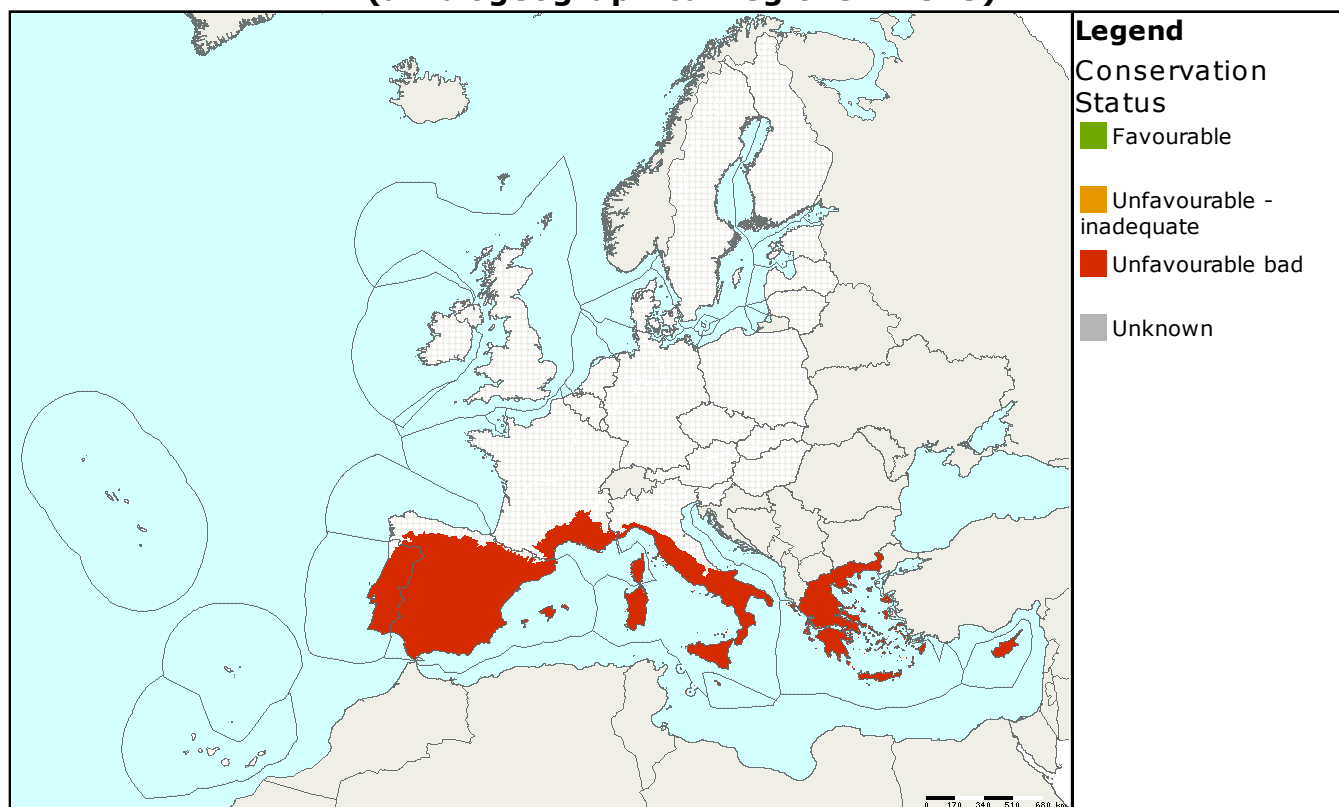

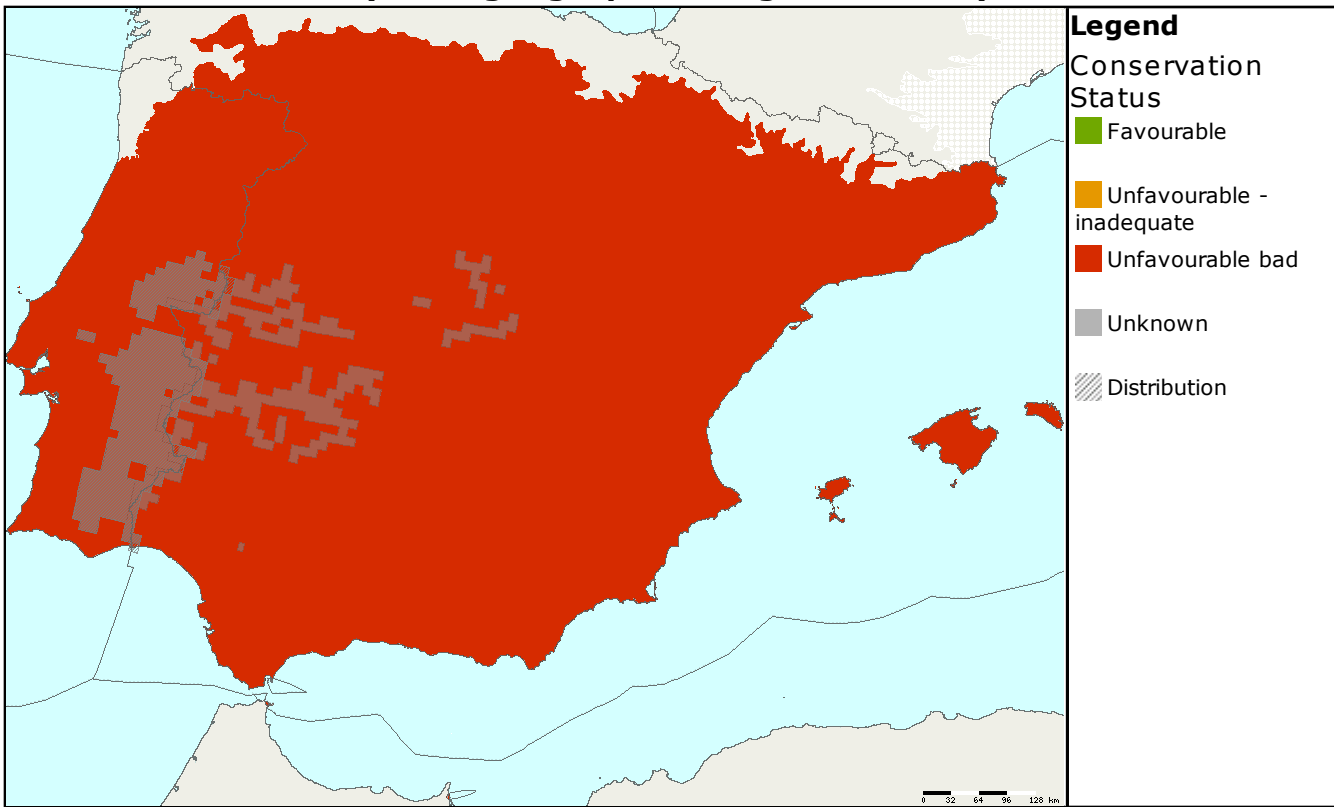

The Iberian Barbel is a freshwater fish species endemic to the Tagus and Guadiana river basins in Spain and Portugal. It has an 'unfavourable-bad' conservation status in the Mediterranean region. It is listed as 'vulnerable' on IUCN Red List.
