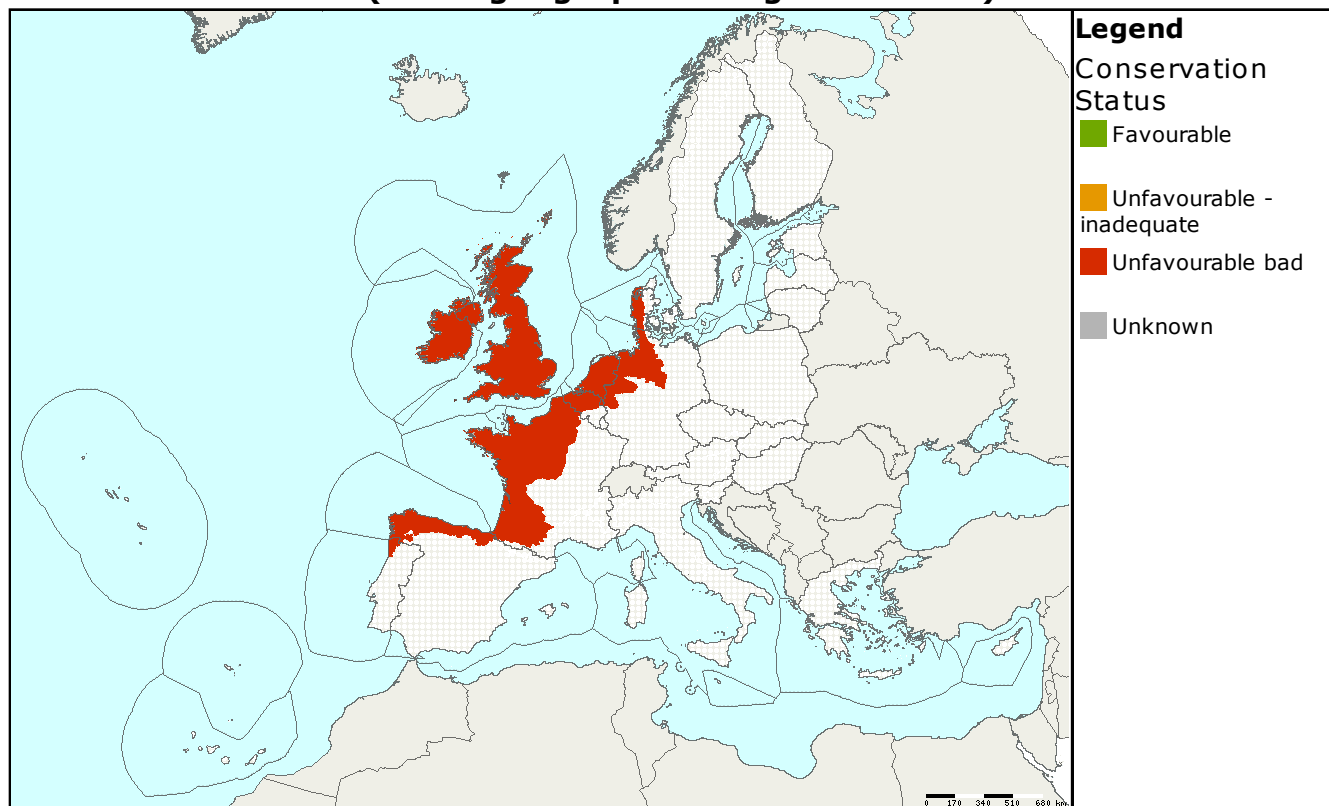

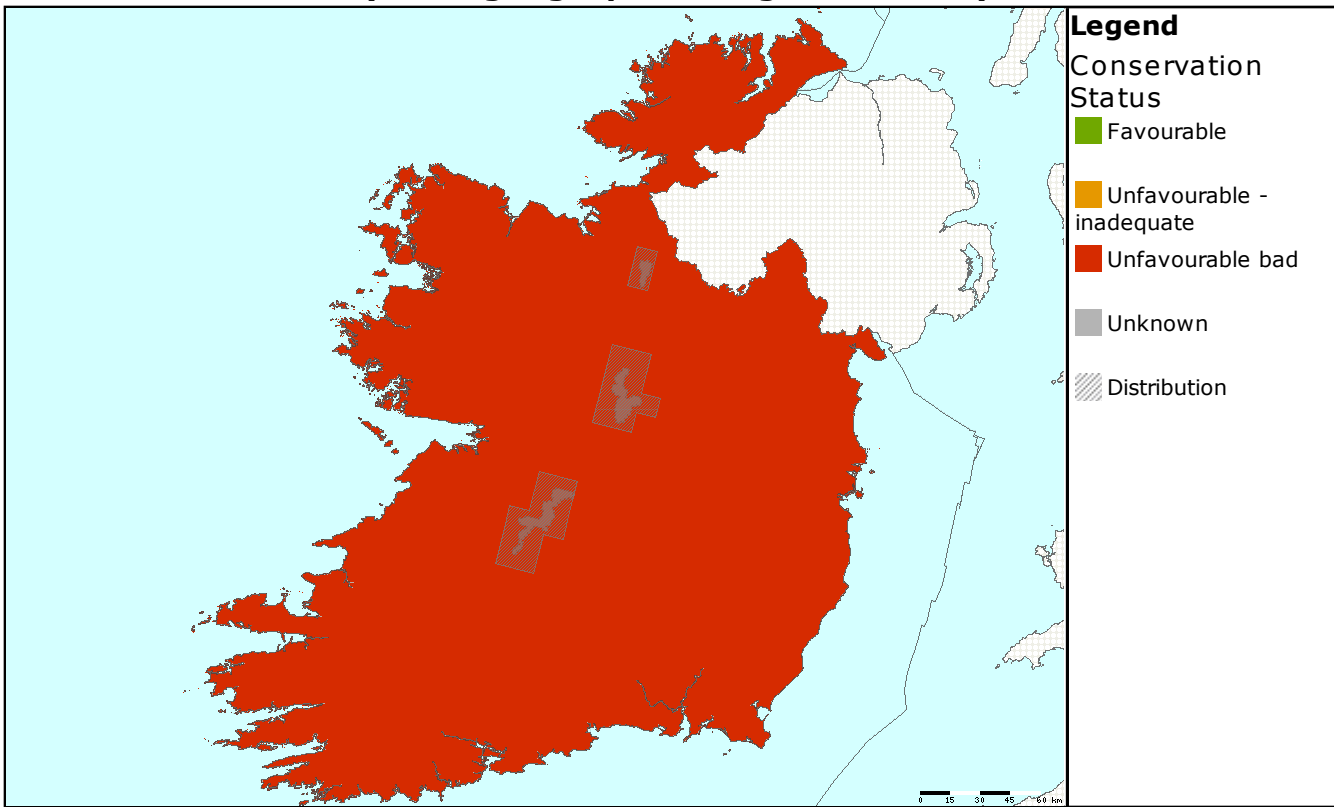

ATL: The pollan (*Coregonus autumnalis*) is confined in W. Europe to a series of large lakes on the island of Ireland. Species were described in the literature as *C. autumnalis pollan* Thompson (1856). The currently accepted classification is simply *C. autumnalis* Pallas 1776." The species does not have a defined Natura2000 code and does not correspond with *Coregonus autumnalis autumnalis* (Natura 2000 code 5053). There are 3 populations of pollan in the Republic of Ireland, their size is unknown but variously estimated as 1% of fish biomass in the relevant lakes and hundreds – low thousands per lake. Its overall assessment is "bad" because state of its populations was evaluated as "bad".
