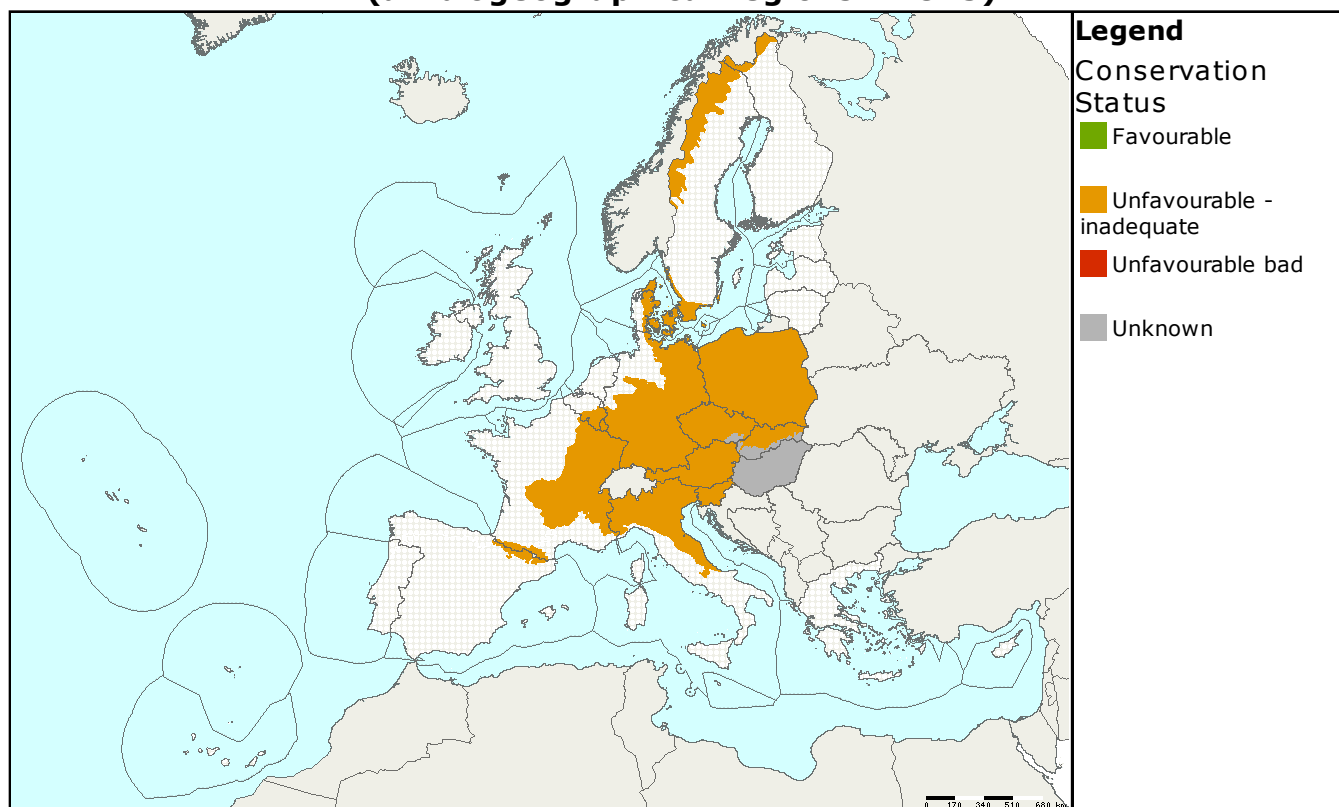

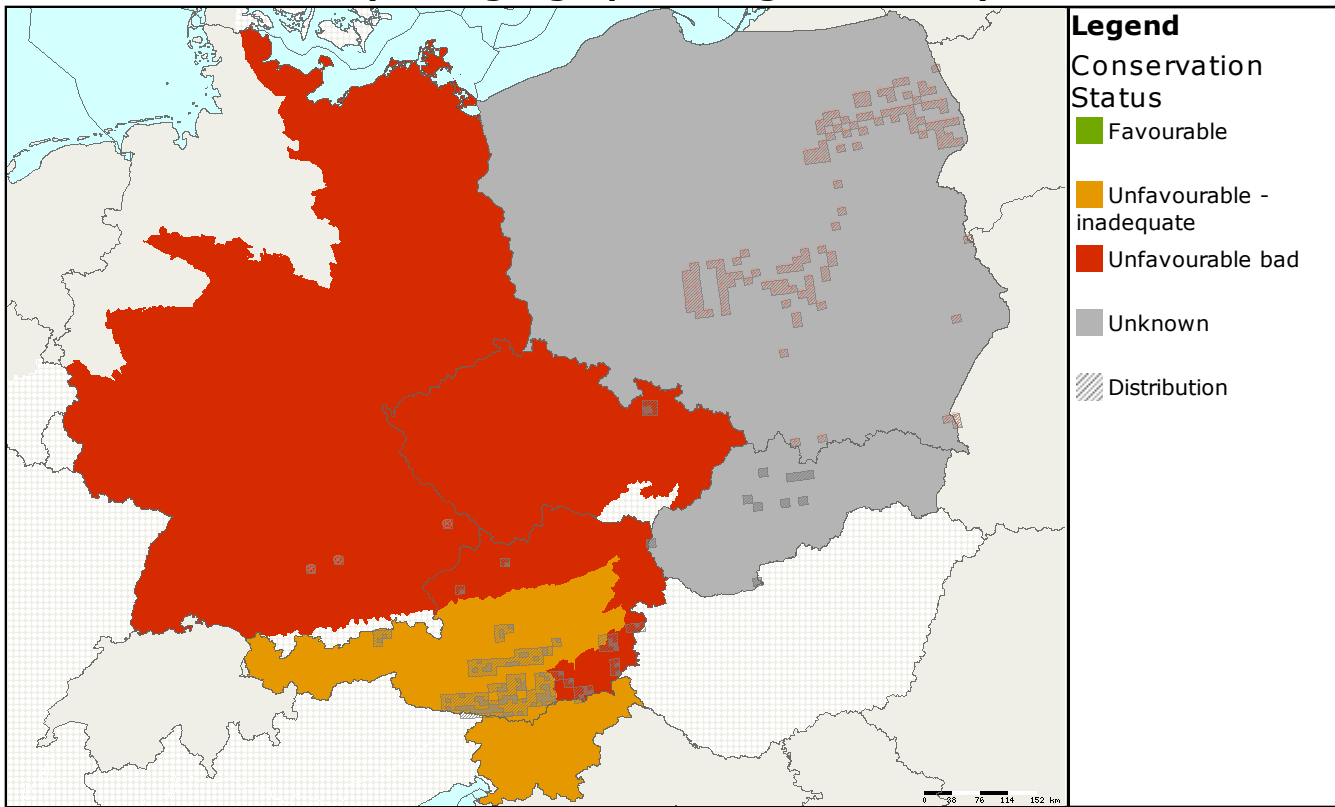

The Ukrainian brook lamprey is a fish which is widely spread in Central and eastern European countries. It depends on freshwater bodies (mainly rivers) in lowland mountain zones.

In the Alpine and Continental region the status of this species was assessed as unfavourable 'inadequate'. The status in the Pannonic region remains 'unknown' due to lacking data from Slovakia. In none of the countries wherein this species occurs, it has a 'favourable' overall status. Important data from Poland and Slovakia are lacking and required for a better assessment. The IUCN suspects this species of a slow declination but still it has a conservation status of 'Least Concern'.
