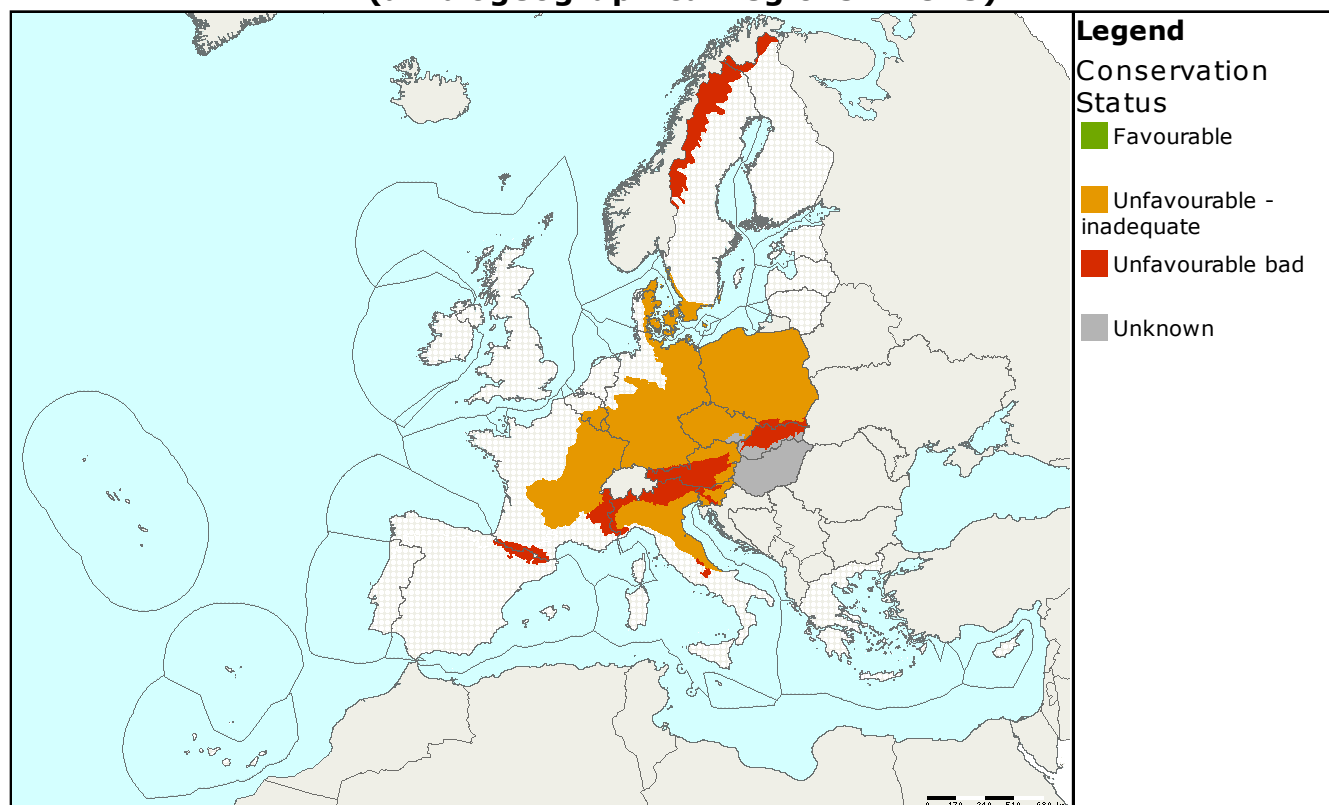

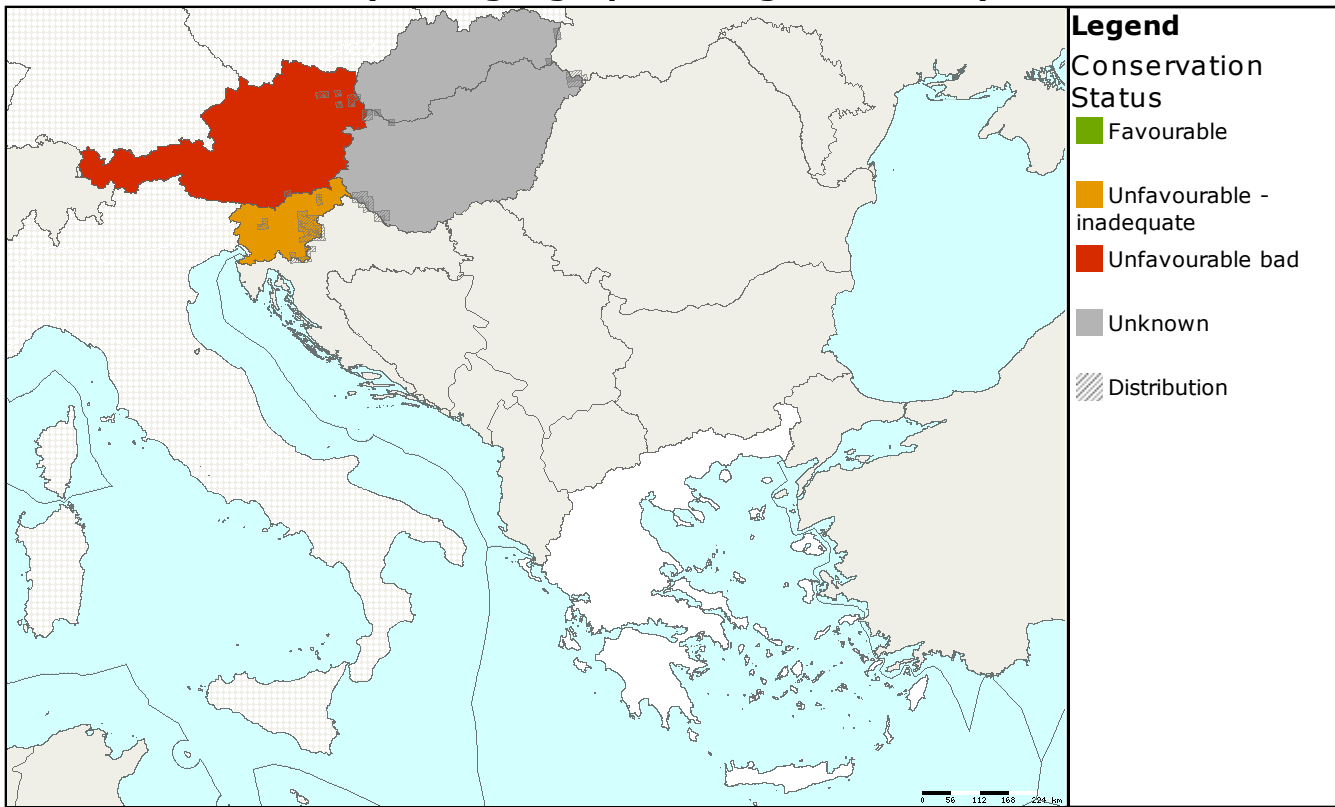

The Danube gudgeon is a fish species occurring in Danube tributaries. It lives in riffles of small, fast-flowing rivers and bottom of large rivers with water velocities of 0.7 m/s and more, prefers stone bottom. Species is particularly sensitive to pollution and damming. The current valid scientific name is *Romanogobio uranoscopus*.

Conservation status of the species is 'unfavourable-bad' in Alpine region. However, its status in Slovenia is 'unfavourable-inadequate' and 'unknown' in Slovakia. For Continental region conservation status is 'unfavourable-inadequate' with 'unfavourable-bad' report from Austria. There is a major lack of data for Pannonian region resulting in 'unknown' overall assessment. It is categorised as 'least concern' by IUCN.
