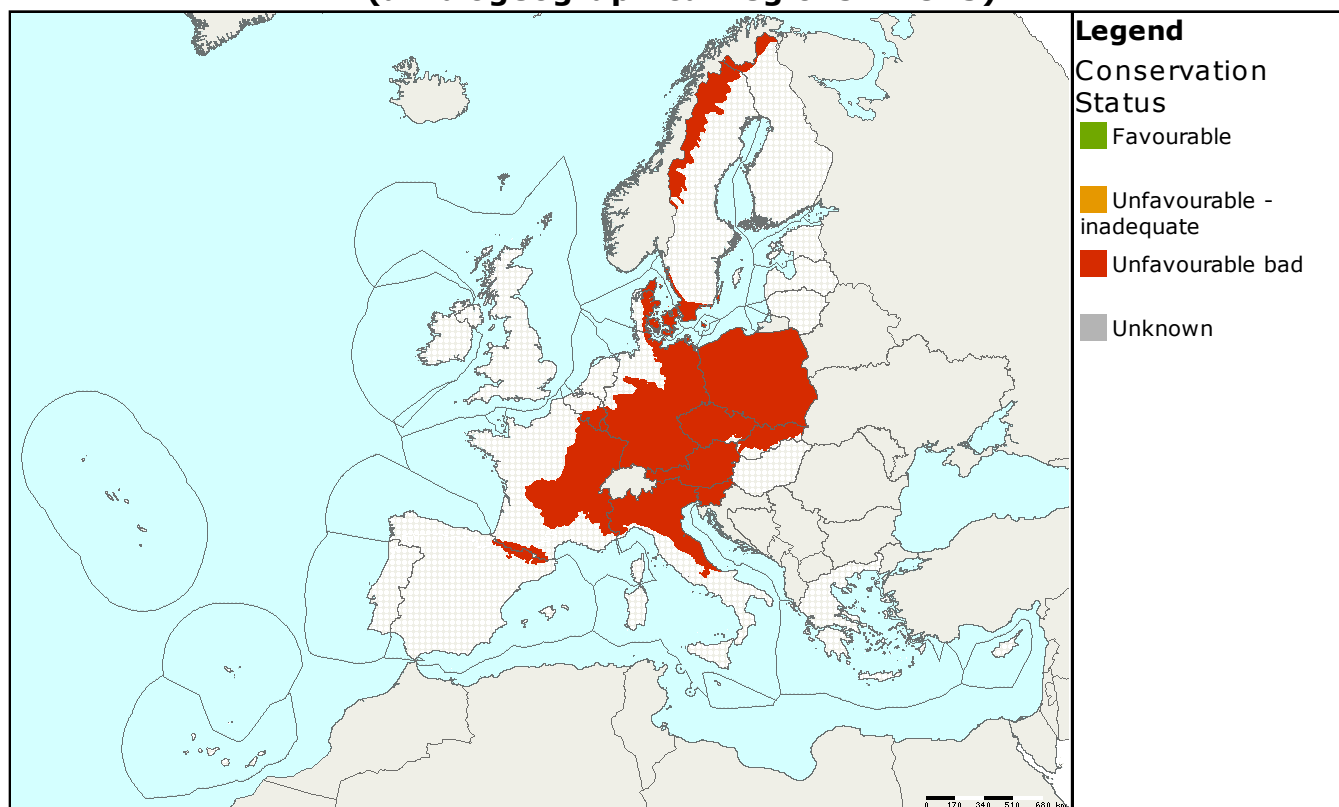

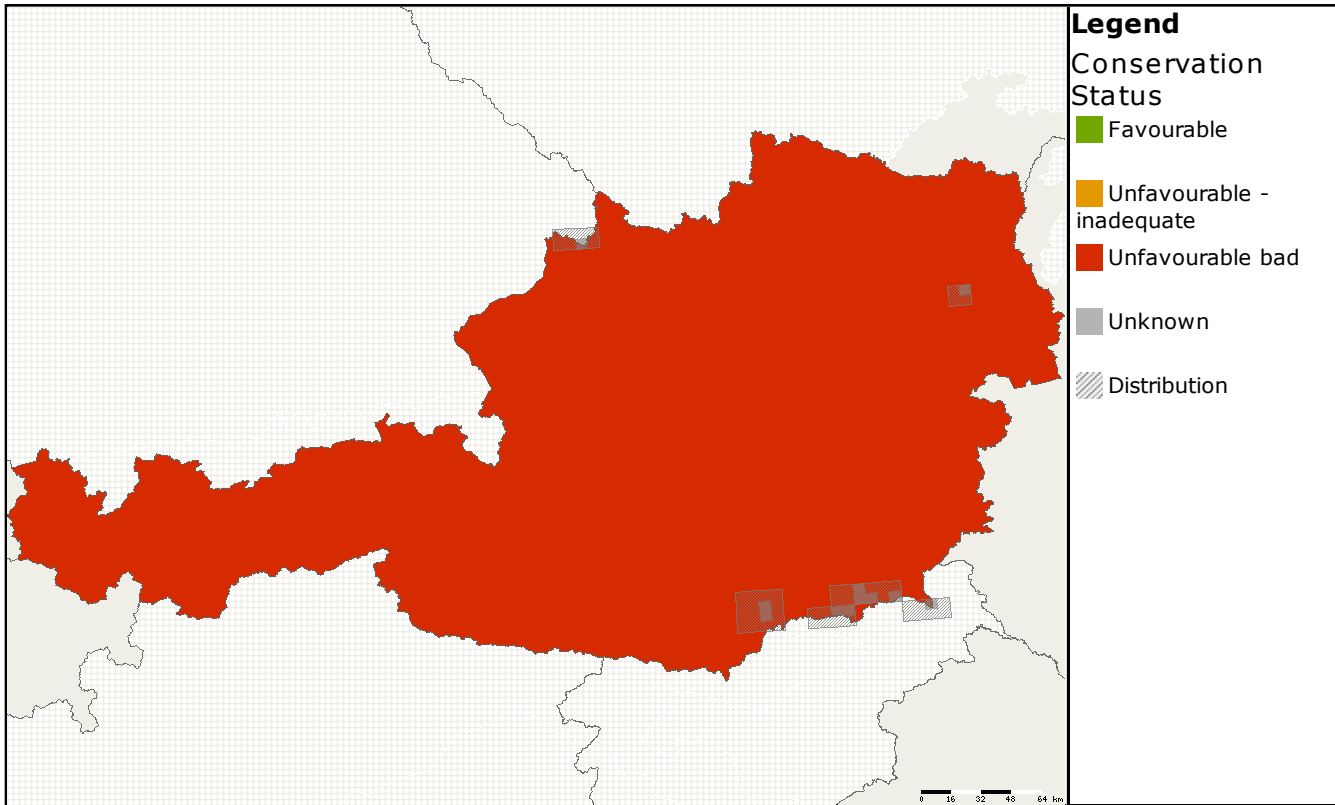

This barbell species was reported only from Austria but taxonomical affiliation of short living species of this genus is unclear at present in Austria. The specimens of this fish are considered as *B. petenyi* in the current Red List. *B. petenyi* is a species occurring in the stands with sandy or gravelly bottom in upper and middle parts of streams, with clear and cold water. It is known from Danube drainage in Romania and Bulgaria. In Austria this species is found in the lower part of the rivers.

The conservation status in both biogeographical regions is 'unfavourable bad', all of the parameters are in 'unfavourable bad' status. The species is particularly threatened by regulation of water courses and manipulation of water levels.
