



A steppe beetle occurring in the steppe areas from the central Europe to the eastern Siberia. Subspecies C.h.hungaricus occurs in the Pannonian basin. Within the EU it is recorded as well from Austria and Romania. It is a species of steppic and xerophilous grasslands on sands or on rocky slopes.

The conservation status in the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable bad'; the favourable range and the population size are much higher than actual. In the Pannonian biogeographical region the status is 'favourable', but the populations on the margins of the natural range, in Slovakia and in Czech Republic, are in 'unfavourable bad' status. Many historic localities in peripheral zone of the natural range are lost mainly due to succession or destruction of the suitable habitats.
