



The scarce heath is a butterfly lives in central Europe and Scandinavia. They fly in one generation from May to July.

For Alpine biogeographical region the species is reported by Austria and Slovakia. Its overall assessment is 'favourable' because it was evaluated in all 4 parameters as 'favourable' for more than 94% of its population. In other regions it is not doing so well with overall assessments of 'unfavourable-bad' for Boreal, Atlantic and Continental regions. Only in Latvia it was reported as 'favourable'.
