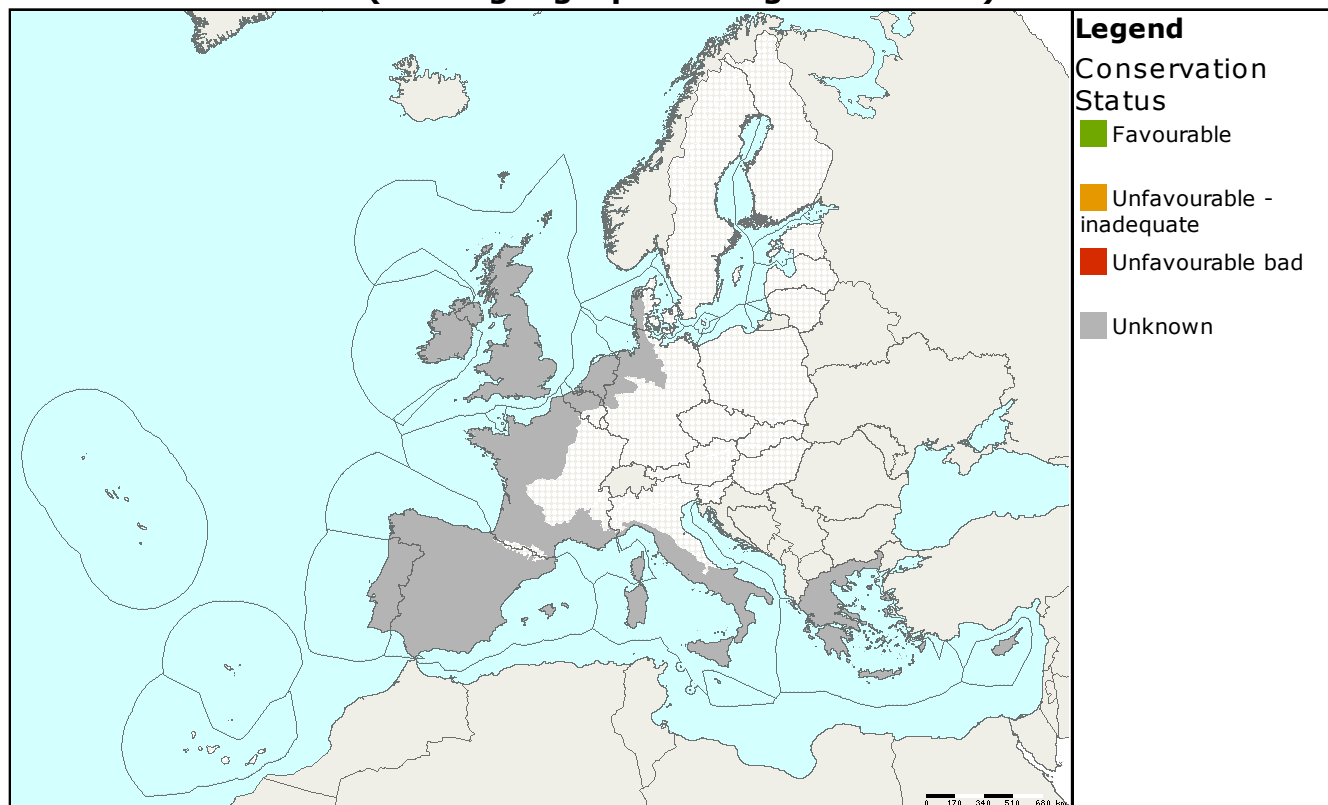

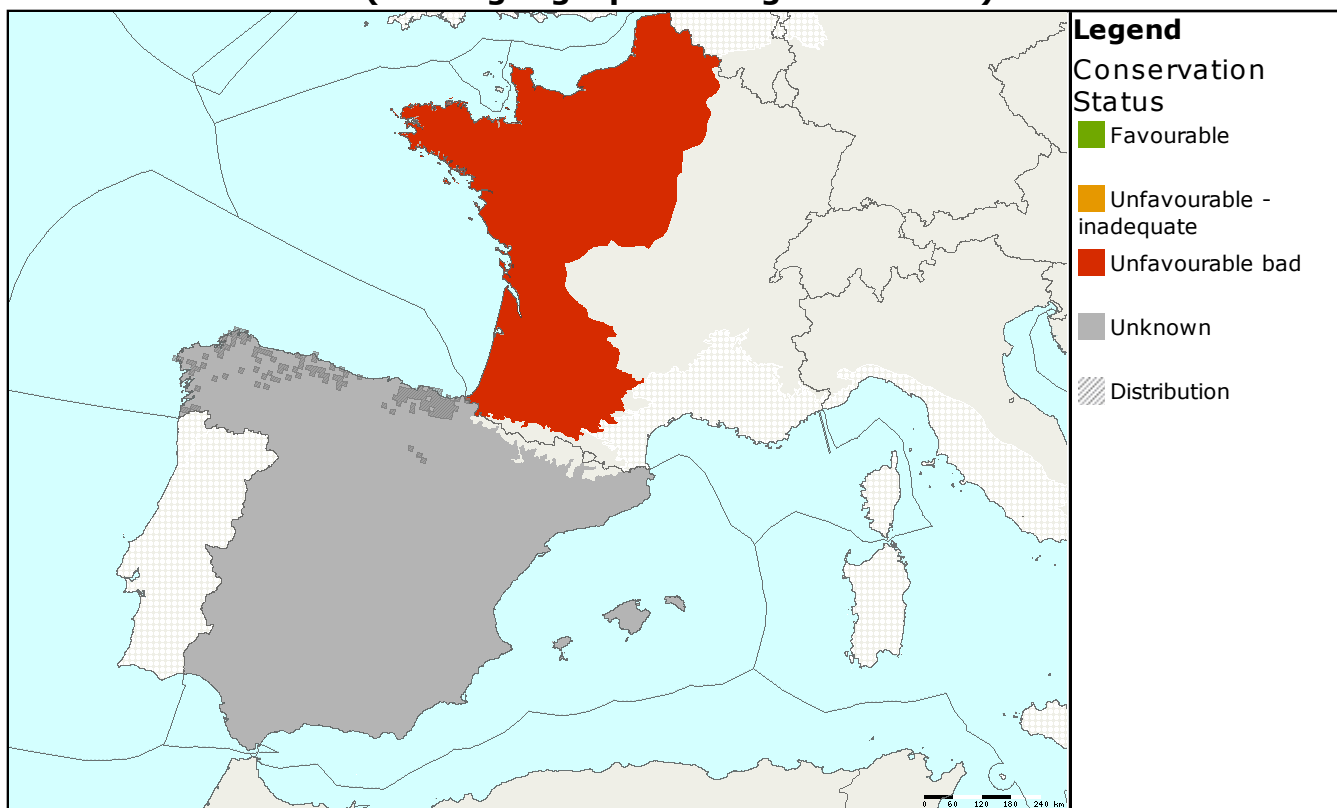

A terrestrial gastropod endemic to France and Spain. It is a species with disjunctive natural range occurring in the areas with strong Atlantic climate in Brittany and along the Spanish Atlantic coast. It occurs on shaded and humid stands in forests, in wet heaths, along water courses or on wet shaded rocks.

The conservation status of this in general poorly known species is 'unknown' in both the Atlantic and the Mediterranean biogeographical regions. Better information is required. The species can be threatened by variety of human activities, which are deteriorating its microhabitats.
