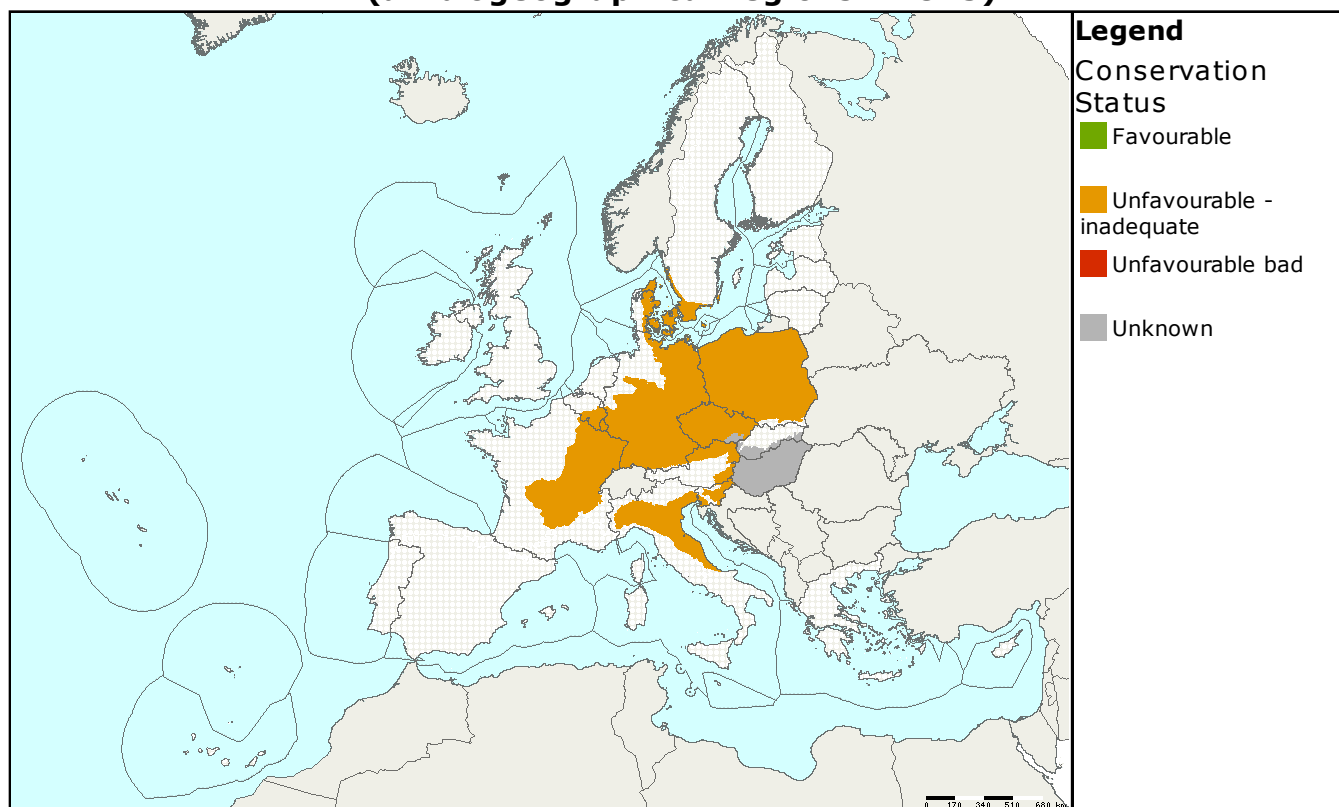

A rare species of moth occurring in the southern and the south-eastern Europe. Within the EU it is known as well from Bulgaria, Romania and Italy. Its occurrence is always localised. It inhabits oak shrub forests, light open oak forest and forest fringes in karst areas.

The conservation status in the Continental biogeographical region is 'unfavourable inadequate'. Although the data on the population size are not available the species is thought to be on decline. The conservation status in the Pannonian biogeographical regions is 'unknown', but on the other hand the actual range and the population size are not sufficient.
