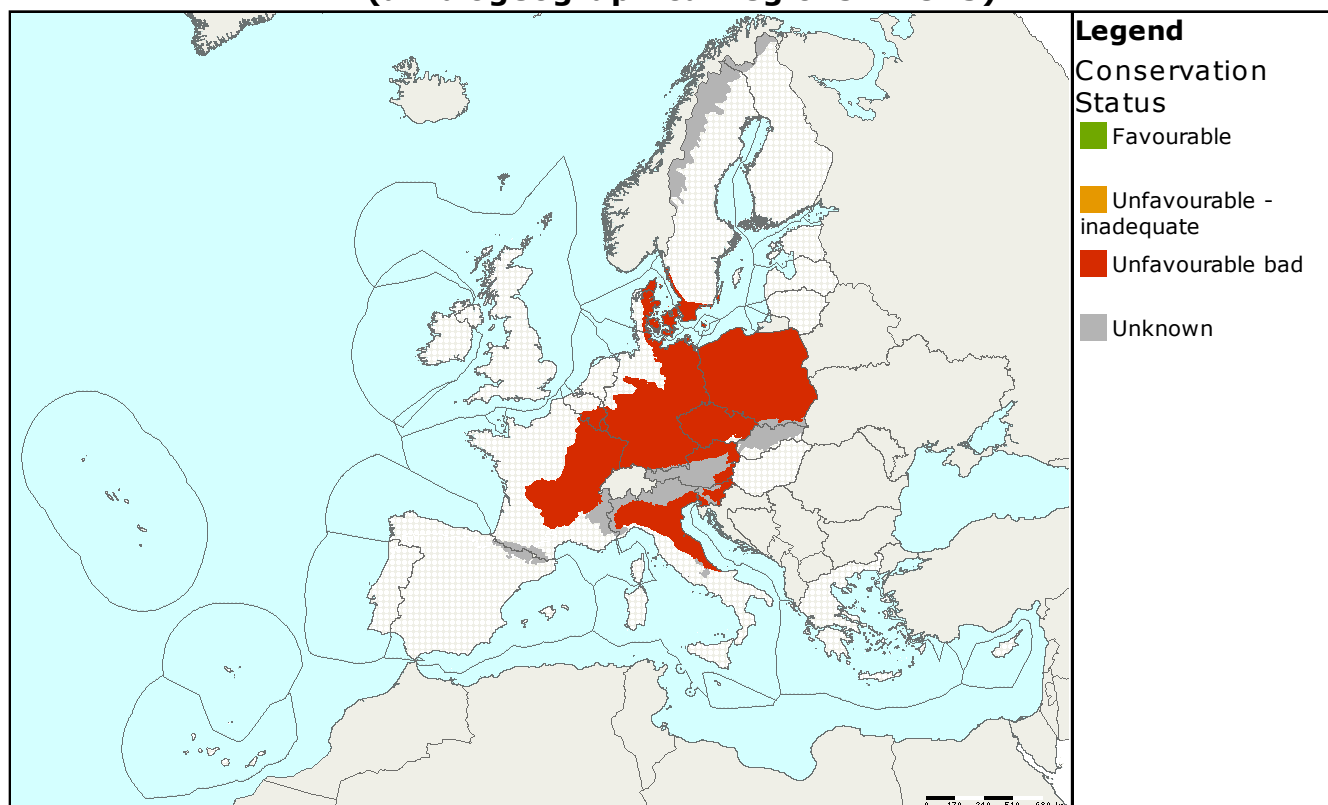

The Sudeten Ringlet is a European species of butterfly. Its disjunctive range is restricted to several countries. It is further present in Romania and Switzerland. It can be found in moist mountain, subalpine and alpine meadows, forest fringes and clearings.

The conservation status in the Alpine biogeographical region, where the species is present only in France is 'unknown'. In the Continental biogeographical region it was assessed as 'unfavourable bad', although the precise information on the trends and on the reference values is often not available. The species is evaluated as 'vulnerable' in Europe, although this evaluation regards Polish population as extinct. The species was recently rediscovered in this country.
