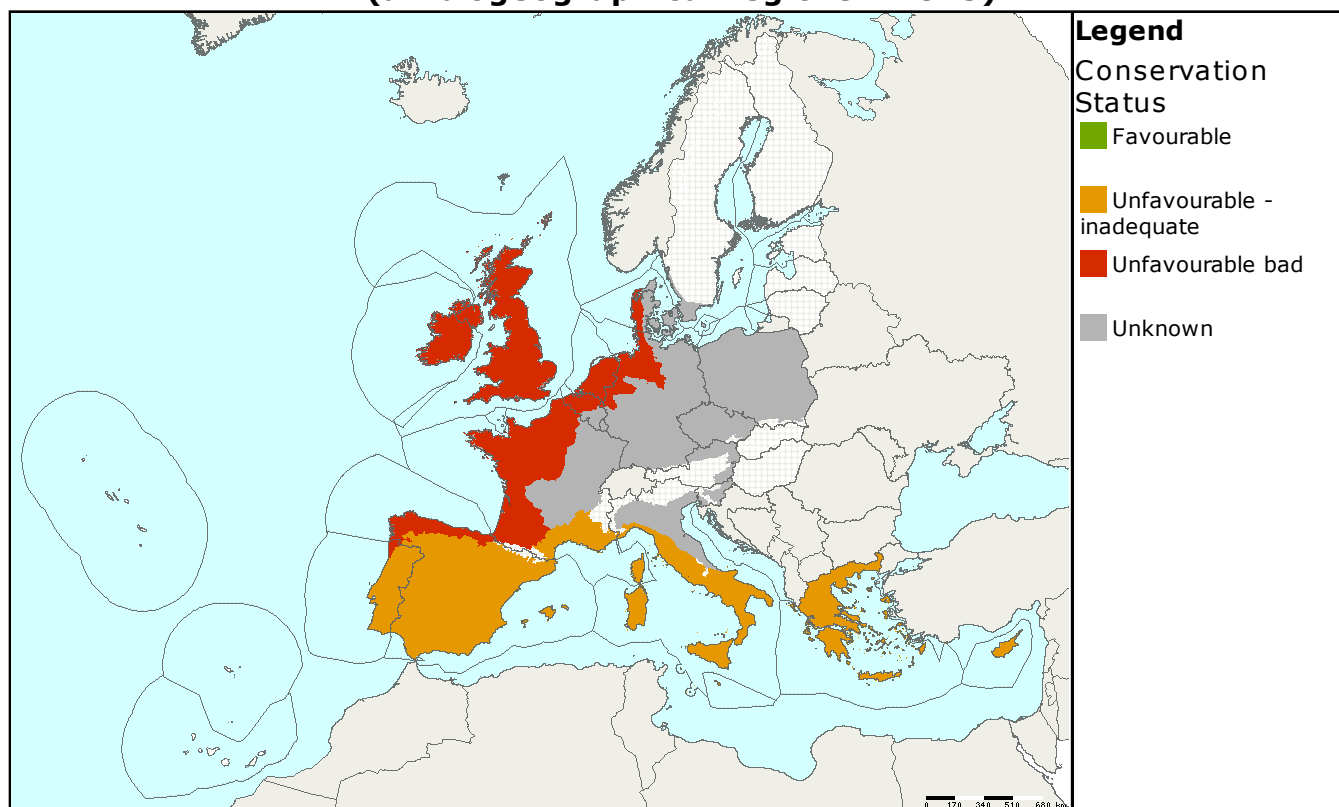

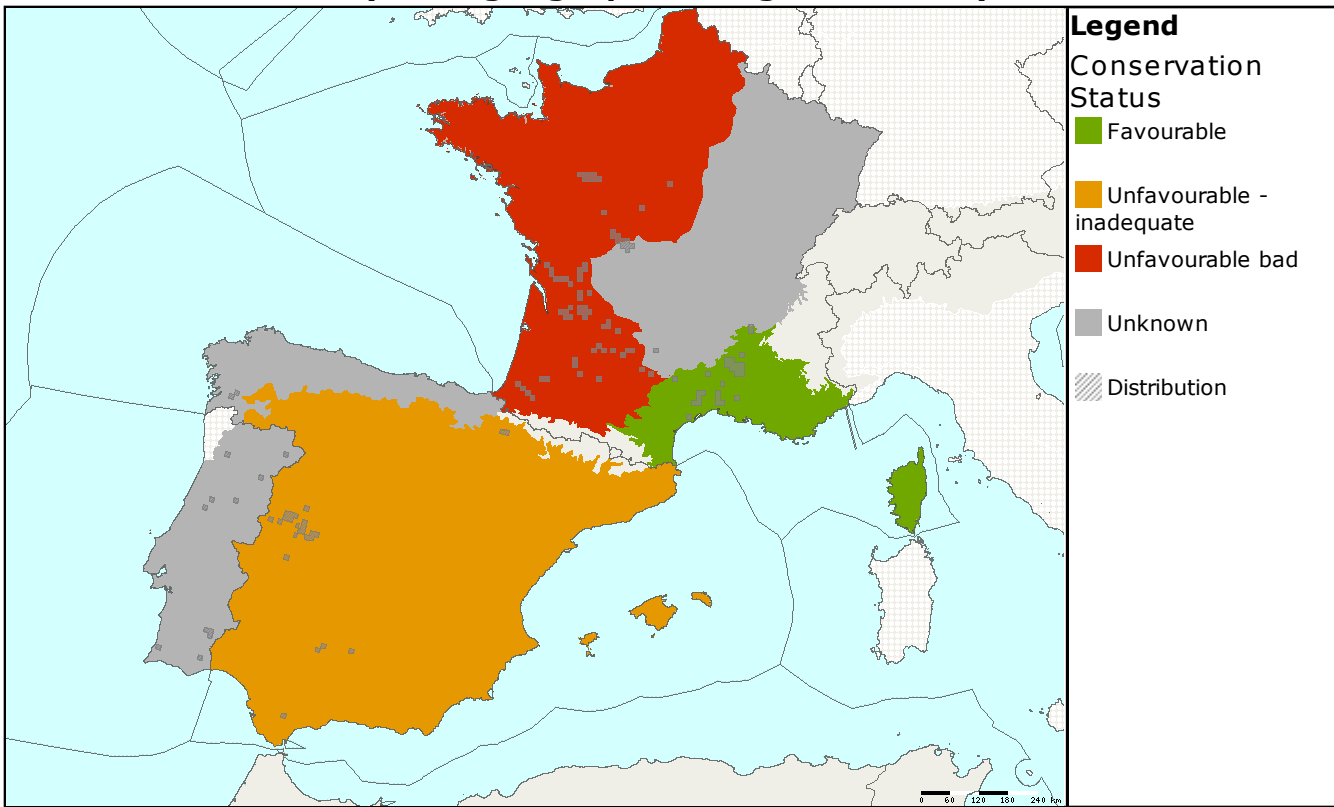

Gomphus graslinii is a dragonfly species which only occurs in France, Spain and Portugal. It is dependent of slowly flowing freshwater streams.

In the three geographical regions this species occurs, the Atlantic, Continental and Mediterranean region, it has been assessed as, respectively, ‘bad’, ‘unknown’ and ‘inadequate’. In some parts of France its status is ‘favourable’. However, the most important parts of the habitat have been poorly assessed till thus far. Many data from Spain and in particular Portugal are lacking. According to the IUCN its population is decreasing and its IUCN conservation status is ‘Near Threatened’.
